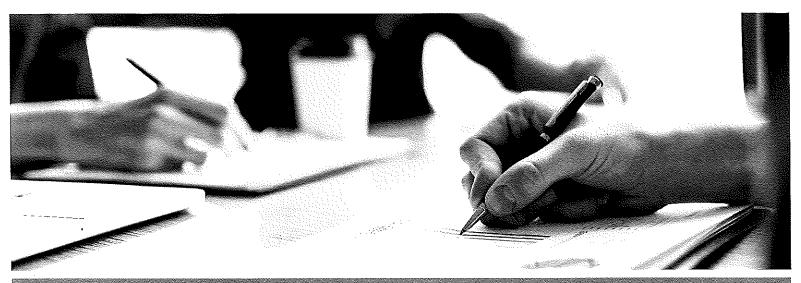

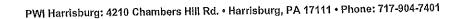

<u>Appendix 'A'</u> <u>Potterfield Pool Management Agreement</u>

This Agreement between ______(the Company) and the CITY OF HAGERSTOWN (City) is to provide for the operation and management by the Company of the Potterfield Pool and related amenities located at 730 Frederick Street in Hagerstown, MD ("the Pool"), in accordance with the specifications, conditions, and terms set forth herein.

- **1. TERM:** This Agreement, when executed by both parties, shall be in effect from January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2027 and shall automatically renew for three successive one (1) year terms beginning January 1, 2028 unless either party gives written notice 90 days prior to the conclusion of the then current term.
- 2. **SCHEDULE:** The Company shall meet the following milestones throughout the pool season:
 - February 19th Preseason meeting with City
 - April 30th Preseason meeting with City and finalize pool preseason preparation (Section 6) And deadline to apply for Health Department permits (Section 8),
 - May 8th Deadline for Health Department inspection, submitting to the City the managers' names (and contact information, pool status report due, and initial lifeguard schedule),
 - May 22nd -- Deadline for pool being fully ready for the public and submitting to the City the checklists, Emergency Action Plans and other operational documents
 - Saturday prior to Memorial Day first day of swimming
 - Labor Day Last day of swimming
 - Pooch Plunge Tuesday after Labor Day (when applicable)
 - October 1st Pool closing (Section 22)

Pool and sprayground (AKA splashpad) shall be permitted, open, and "swim ready" no later than **May 20**th of each year of the contract, and continuing through Labor Day weekend. Lifeguards shall be on duty beginning Memorial Day weekend, and continuing through Labor Day. Lifeguard hours and pool operating schedule shall be approved by the City of Hagerstown and shall be provided to the City for review prior to May 8th (Lifeguard Schedule).

- 3. ACCESS: The City will provide three sets of keys and access to the pool site no later than February 1. The Company shall keep and safeguard keys and release keys only to authorized personnel. If the City chooses to change locks at the pool during the term of this contract, three new sets of keys shall be provided to the City of Hagerstown.
- 4. **ITEMS PROVIDED BY CITY:** The City agrees to furnish, at no cost to the Company, all of the following:
 - Water
 - Electricity
 - Receptacles for trash, garbage pick-up service
 - Telephone and internet
 - Pool operating equipment
 - Digital copy of past pool rules, checklists, and employee conduct expectations
 - Safety equipment backboard, ring buoy(s), rescue tube(s), Shepherd's hook(s), first aid kit, and rope with buoys
 - Paper products, pool house cleaning supplies, two (2) first aid kits and extra band-aids
 - One set of walkie-talkies (per season)
 - Automated external defibrillator
 - Mowing of the grass
 - Installation and care of the shade canopies

- **10. WARRANTY:** Company represents and warrants that it has specific knowledge of all applicable laws, codes, and regulations, whether State, County, Municipality, or otherwise, regarding the Pool operation and maintenance, including, without limitations, providing the required number of properly trained lifeguards and CPOs, and will ensure that its employees, agents, and other parties follow all applicable laws, codes, and regulations.
- 11. PERSONNEL: All the Company's obligations under this agreement shall be carried out or satisfied by employees of the Company as follows:
 - The Company agrees to pay for all Company's employee wages, income tax withholdings, social security withholdings, State unemployment insurance, Federal unemployment insurance, and Worker's Compensation insurance.
 - The Company shall train all employees. Employees not performing up to the standards of the City will be promptly replaced by the Company upon request of the City.
 - Lifeguards employed by the Company shall have a Basic Life Guarding Certificate, a Lifeguard Training Certificate, or the equivalent, as well as CPR and First Aid.
 - Company employees shall go through the Company's orientation training, onsite training, and preseason meeting with the City.
 - Personnel will be trained in the area of blood borne pathogens and provided a blood borne pathogen exposure control kit.
 - The Company will provide a Certified Pool Operators (CPO) and experienced Pool Managers to supervise the staff and manage all Pool operations. Certified Pool Operators (CPO) shall be onsite during all hours when Pool is open.
 - Lifeguards shall have the authority to discipline swimmers and any and all other persons within the Pol, using their best judgment and sole discretion, consistent with the published and posted rules of the City and minimum safety standards as established herein. Company shall notify the City if a patron receives disciplinary action or is permanently removed from the Pool for the season.
 - Company's full time management staff will supervise personnel. Company supervisors shall inspect the City's facilities no less than two (2) times each week to check performance of personnel.
 - Company will typically invest substantial resources to train and convey information concerning operational techniques and management procedures to its employees at the Pool and the City acknowledges that such information and investment is a valuable asset of Company's business.
 - Pool staff shall wear professional uniforms, and be easily identifiable.

Cleaning bathhouse and bathrooms daily and inspecting the same on an hourly basis.

• Cleaning swimming pool(s) deck daily.

- Vacuuming pool as needed. In general, this should result in an overall vacuuming of the pool about two (2) times per week or more often if needed to keep the pool(s) clean.
- Hourly picking up trash and litter. Emptying trash and recyclable receptacles daily and placing containers in the proper location for collection on the appropriate day(s).
- Straightening and cleaning deck furniture.
- Company shall be on standby for alarms and promptly answer all alarm calls and address issue.
- Maintain mechanical equipment.
- At the end of the day, lock and secure all gates and doors. Activate alarm system.
- Implementation of approved Emergency Action Plan.
- Inspect slides , sprayground, rock wall and other features daily.
- Company shall notify the City in writing within 24 hours if an injury or safety violation is reported to the Company by patrons.
- Provide City any Health Department inspections during the pool season within 24 hours of inspection.
- Report and document all action that may jeopardize the spirit and content of this Agreement.
- Enforce pool rules, staff code of conduct and checklists. Copies of prior documents are attached as Attachment 2. See attached as a reference and that Company shall develop its own rules, staff code of conduct, and checklists and provide them to the City on or before May 20th of each year.
- 15. INCLEMENT WEATHER/TEMPORARY CLOSINGS: The Company and City shall develop and agree to criteria for closing the pool, and methods to notify the public via various forms. On days when there is inclement weather, the Company shall keep one (1) lifeguard on duty throughout the scheduled lifeguard hours to handle public inquiries. Weather related closings of the pool shall be at the discretion of the City. Temporary shut-down due to fecal, vomit or thunder/lighting should be handled by Company in accordance with Health Department and Center for Disease Control guidelines.

NO CHANGE IN DATES OF OPERATION OR HOURS OF OPERATION CAN BE ACCEPTED UNLESS WRITTEN AUTHORIZATION IS RECEIVED FROM THE CITY OF HAGERSTOWN

- 16. WATER QUALITY: At no time shall the water chemistry cause a failure of permission to operate the pool as granted by the State, County, City, or other applicable regulatory body. In the event permission is revoked to operate the pool due to poor water quality, the City will assess penalties as listed in Section 25 below. All of the foregoing not withstanding however, the Company shall be excused from maintaining water quality established herein and the City shall not be entitled to a refund in the event of any Act of God, interference by City or other circumstances beyond the control of the Company make such maintenance impossible.
- 17. CHEMICALS AND SUPPLIES: The Company agrees to supply at its own expense all chemicals for safe and clean pool water throughout the term of this contract including, but not limited to sodium hydrochloride, cyanuric acid, muriatic acid, sodium bicarbonate, soda ash, and calcium chloride. The Company shall monitor the chemicals and maintain acceptable water quality. The Company agrees to supply water test kits and first aid kits.
- 18. REPAIR WORK: The Company shall stand ready to perform any repair work necessary during the term of this Agreement. However, the City shall have the option of using another contractor for repair work or complete the work with City staff. When a repair issue presents itself:
 - Company shall promptly provide detailed estimate of costs separating materials and labor
 - After approval in writing by the City, the Company shall promptly perform the necessary actions and invoice the City.

- Clean and store City's deck furniture.
- Remove and store skimmer parts.
- Cover all skimmers with gizmos to prevent the buildup of rain water.
- Remove and store all moveable ladders and lifeguard chairs.
- Drain and store hoses.
- Lubricate filter system valves and grease motor bearings.
- Add winterization chemicals to pool to retard algae growth.
- Prepare pool and pool plumbing lines for freeze protection. Company agrees to use common and accepted winterization techniques, but assumes no responsibility for freeze damage if all the proper procedures are followed. Company will inject anti-freeze in skimmers and related fixtures.
- Request a walk-through inspection with City's staff.

City will complete all "fresh water winterizing" in the pool house

- **23. PRICE PROPOSAL:** The Company hereby proposes to perform the work and services as set forth above by this Agreement, specifications, conditions, and terms as set forth herein as follows:
 - A. LUMP SUM annual fee for contract management, opening, closing, profit and overhead
 - B. PER HOUR rate for management and lifeguards
 - C. LUMP SUM annual fee for chemicals and supplies provided by Company

24. PAYMENTS:

Based upon the proposal above and upon receipt of a monthly invoice with adequate documentation, the City will make monthly payments to Company as follows:

- A. 1/8th of annual contract management fee (months of March-October inclusive)
- B. Lifeguard hours actually used and documented from the previous month, including pool rentals (provide weekly listing)
- C. 1/4th of annual chemical and supplies fee (months of May, June, July and August only)
- D. Less pool rental user fees (Section 13) and/or liquidated damages (Section 25) from the previous month

City will process issue payment within 30 days of receipt of satisfactory invoices and documentation

25. FAILURE TO PERFORM/LIQUIDATED DAMAGES:

- The City will deduct from funds owed Company the amount of \$500 per day for each calendar day after May 10 that the pool is not ready for Health Department inspection or should fail any Health Department inspection. This will be null and void if the delay is directly caused by the City or its contractors.
- The City will deduct from funds owed Company the amount of \$500 per day for each calendar day after May 10 that the pool manager is not hired and trained.
- The City will deduct from funds owed Company the amount of \$500 per day for each calendar day after May 20 that the pool is not ready for public opening as determined by the City. This will be null and void if the delay is directly caused by the City or its contractors.
- The City will deduct from funds owed Company the amount of \$500 per day for each calendar day throughout the season that there is inadequate number of guards that the pool cannot be opened, or pool amenities cannot be safely operated.
- The City will deduct from the funds owed Company the amount of \$500 per day for each calendar day of the operating season the pool is not ready for public opening as determined by the City. This will be null and void if the delay is directly caused by the City or its contractors.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move to award the bids for gasoline and diesel fuel transport deliveries under four (4) separate contracts to the responsive, responsible bidders who submitted the lowest bids. Item No. 7 of the bid will be contingent upon individual departmental requirements.

- 1. Contract for gasoline tank-wagon deliveries to AC&T Company, Inc. of Hagerstown, MD, at the unit bidder factor prices as stated in its bid dated October 21, 2025.
- 2. Contract for gasoline transport deliveries to Petroleum Traders Corporation of Fort Wayne, IN., at the unit bidder factor prices as stated in its bid dated October 21, 2025.
- 3. Contract for diesel tank-wagon deliveries to AC&T Company, Inc. of Hagerstown, MD, at the unit bidder factor prices as stated in its bid dated October 21, 2025.
- 4. Contract for diesel transport deliveries to Petroleum Traders Corporation of Fort Wayne, IN., at the unit bidder factor prices stated in its bid dated October 21, 2025.

REPORT-IN-BRIEF: The following tabulations listed below were made from the bids received on October 22, 2025, based on the bid factor submitted for the contract period that is tentatively to begin on December 1, 2025, and end on November 30, 2026. The contracts are for a one (1) year term with no option to renew. These are requirements contracts, and the County guarantees neither a maximum nor a minimum quantity.

The Invitation to Bid was advertised on the State of Maryland's eMMA "eMaryland Marketplace Advantage" website and the County's new online bidding website (Ionwave/Euna). Eight (8) persons/companies registered/downloaded the bid document online and seven (7) bids were received. The bids were evaluated based on the bidder's bid factor; bids were submitted as per the attached bid tabulation.

Loss of, partial failure of or insufficient capacity of utilities such as, but not limited to, electrical service, open circuit breakers or fuses external to those listed on the equipment list, water service, fuel sources, or other building faults and malfunctions. External power wiring, circuit breakers, and disconnects supplying electrical service to the listed equipment. Refinishing, repair, replacement, cleaning, or modification of duct work louvers, cabinetry, housings, bases, mountings, foundations, supporting structures, trim or decorations. All emergency freight and expediting charges. Additional maintenance and adjustments required by the Customer. The cost of providing a rental generator while the permanent generator is being repaired. Maintenance on a Fire Pump covers the DIESEL ENGINE ONLY. Service Contractor is not responsible for damage to roofing as a result of leaks, equipment failure, or component failure; however, we will make every effort to protect the area while services are performed.

Clarifications

Customer shall permit Service Contractor free and timely access to areas and the Covered Equipment and allow Service Contractor to start and stop the Covered Equipment as necessary to perform required services. Customer is responsible for providing adequate and legal parking arrangements for our technicians during service visits. This includes ensuring that suitable parking is available in close proximity to the industrial generators and that access routes are free from obstruction. Any costs incurred by Service Contractor for delays (e.g., labor hours), additional costs or fees, and/or penalties (e.g., parking fines) incurred due to the lack of suitable parking or site access will be the responsibility of Customer. In cases where specialized access or permits are required, Customer must arrange and pay for such access or permits in advance to avoid service interruptions.

Used oil, coolant, and filters removed from contracted equipment is recycled utilizing a third-party vendor in accordance with EPA guidelines.

The Agreement price is conditioned upon the Covered Equipment being in a maintainable condition. If the initial inspection or initial seasonal start-up indicates repairs are required, a firm quotation will be submitted for Customer's approval. Should Customer not authorize the repairs and service recommended by the Service Contractor, the Service Contractor may either remove the unacceptable system(s) component(s) or part(s) from the scope of this Agreement and adjust the annual Agreement price or terminate this Agreement.

This Agreement applies only to the maintainable/moving components of the system(s). Repair or replacement of non-maintainable/non-moving parts such as duct work, boiler shell and tubes, cabinets, boiler refractory material, heat exchangers, evaporator or condenser coils, refrigerant (piping and leaks), main power service and electrical wiring, electrical boards, gas valves, structural supports, tube bundles, oil storage tanks, and other similar items are excluded from labor and parts coverage.

Select Plus Terms and Conditions

Throughout this Agreement:

Hagerstown Water Department shall be known as the Customer.

Fidelity Power Systems shall be known as the Service Contractor.

These terms and conditions of the Agreement (the "Agreement") and all of the sections included, are integral parts of and form the Agreement between the Service Contractor and the Customer. In the event the Customer seeks to have the Service Contractor enter into a separate written contract for the scope of work of this Agreement, then: (1) the separate written contract must be acceptable to the Contractor; (2) the entire Agreement shall be attached to and incorporated by reference in such separate written contract; (3) to the extent that there is a conflict between the terms and conditions of the Agreement and the terms and conditions of the separate written contract, the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall control; and (4) if the Contractor and the Customer are unable to agree upon a mutually acceptable separate written contract, the Contractor shall have the right to rescind the quote included with this Agreement without liability to the Contractor.

The Service Contractor accepts the care of the equipment listed in the Asset Maintenance Schedule (the "Covered Equipment") as applicable to the Program. The Covered Equipment shall be maintained in the condition that exists at the beginning of the Term. Any defective components, excessive wear, maladjustments, improper installation, improper design, service by others, improper operation, or misapplication, shall not be considered the responsibility of the Service Contractor, other than normal Preventive Maintenance. Repairs and service required in restoring the Covered Equipment's capacity, reliability, design efficiency, or other shortcomings shall only be repaired with authorization and invoiced at normal service rates in addition to vehicle and other related service charges.

The Customer agrees to employ the Service Contractor exclusively for the service and repair work of the Covered Equipment and promptly notify the Service Contractor of any condition of the Covered Equipment that is unusual or that may adversely affect its operation and reliability. Any alterations, additions, adjustments, or repairs made by others, unless authorized or agreed upon by the Service Contractor in writing, will be cause for Service Contractor to terminate or renegotiate the Service Contractor's obligation under this Agreement. This Agreement shall not include maintenance, repairs, service or replacements necessitated by any loss or damage resulting from any cause beyond the control of the Service Contractor, including but not limited to damage or loss due to lack of water, freezing, loss or insufficient electric power or fuel source, hall, flood, windstorm, excessive rain, snow, freezing weather, lightning, earthquake, theft, fire, riots of any origin, strikes, wars, misuse, negligence by person(s) other than those representing the Service Contractor, vandalism, acts of government, building code requirements, insurance company requirements, unauthorized adjustments or repairs, or any other peril or act of God. The cost of all repairs, modifications, or alterations necessitated by the above shall be the responsibility of the Customer and payable to the Service Contractor at Service Contractor's current service rates in addition to vehicle and other related service charges.

All reasonable efforts shall be extended in performing the service as requested by the Customer, but the Service Contractor shall not be liable for any losses or consequential damage that arise out of delays, misuse by the Customer, or the Customer's agents or employees. Replacement and installation of equipment, components, or accessories that fall to provide satisfactory performance due to obsolescence or design conditions are not included in the scope of the Agreement.

The Customer agrees to pay the Service Contractor as set forth in the Agreement. The terms of payment for all other invoices submitted by the Service Contractor are net thirty (30) days from the Customer's receipt of such invoice. The Customer's obligation to pay the Contractor shall not be contingent upon or delayed by prior payment of a third-party, including but not limited to any





or supported equipment, high or unusual utility cost, investment cost of substitute facilities, or rental of equipment. During the Term of the Agreement, the Service Contractor agrees to either repair or replace any defective work performed by the Service Contractor. The determination as to whether such work is to be repaired or replaced is within the sole discretion of the Service Contractor. Unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the Service Contractor and the Customer, upon the termination of this Agreement or the expiration of the Term, whichever occurs first, the Service Contractor shall have no further obligations to repair or replace work performed during the Term, and Customer shall be responsible for maintaining the Covered Equipment upon the termination of this Agreement or the expiration of the Term, whichever occurs first. Any warranty of the materials, parts and equipment installed by Service Contractor

shall be subject to the manufacturers' standard warranty terms, if any, and Customer's exclusive remedy with respect to any claims of defects in such materials, parts or equipment shall be governed by the manufacturers' standard warranty. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Customer shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Service Contractor, its agent and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses and expenses (including but not limited to attorneys' fees) arising out of or resulting from the performance of work hereunder, provided that such claim, damage, loss or expense is caused in whole or in part by an active or passive act or omission of the Customer, anyone directly or indirectly employed by the Customer, or anyone for whose acts the Customer may be liable, regardless of whether it is caused in part by the negligence of the Service Contractor. Further and notwithstanding the preceding sentence, the Service Contractor shall be held harmless by the Customer and shall not be liable to the Customer for any claims, liabilities, damages, losses and expenses related to mold or the creation of mold at the Customer's location(s) and shall have no obligation to treat, identify or remove such mold.

The Customer agrees to not solicit or hire employees of Service Contractor and/or the Service Contractor's subcontractors for itself and/or for any corporation, which Customer now represents or with which Customer now or may later be affiliated during the term of this Agreement and for a period of one year after the termination of the Agreement.

PANDEMIC AND EPIDEMIC PRECAUTIONS

The Customer and the Service Contractor acknowledge that pandemics and/or epidemics may severely impact the location where the services will be performed. As a result, in the event of a pandemic and/or epidemic, Federal, State and Local guidelines and requirements may be imposed and modified, which may impact the timing and cost of the services under the Agreement.

The Customer and the Service Contractor agree that: (1) the Customer and the Service Contractor will both use commercially reasonable efforts with respect to the services under the Agreement; (2) the Customer and the Service Contractor and their respective employees, agents and representatives will comply with applicable Federal, State and Local government quarantines, shelter-in-place orders, regulations, executive orders and/or directives, including but not limited to any recommendations or requirements of the Centers for Disease Control, U.S. Department of Labor, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, and/or any comparable State or Local agencies (collectively, "Pandemic/Epidemic Requirements"); (3) the Customer and the Service Contractor will both use commercially reasonable efforts to keep each other informed of pertinent updates or developments regarding their obligations to comply with Pandemic/Epidemic Requirements; and (4) if the Service Contractor's performance of the services under the Agreement is delayed, suspended and/or effected by Pandemic/Epidemic Requirements and/or by their direct or indirect impacts, the Service Contractor shall be entitled to adjustments to the schedule and/or the prices under the Agreement, provided the Service Contractor notifies the Customer within a reasonable period of time after the Service Contractor learns of the delay, suspension and/or effect.

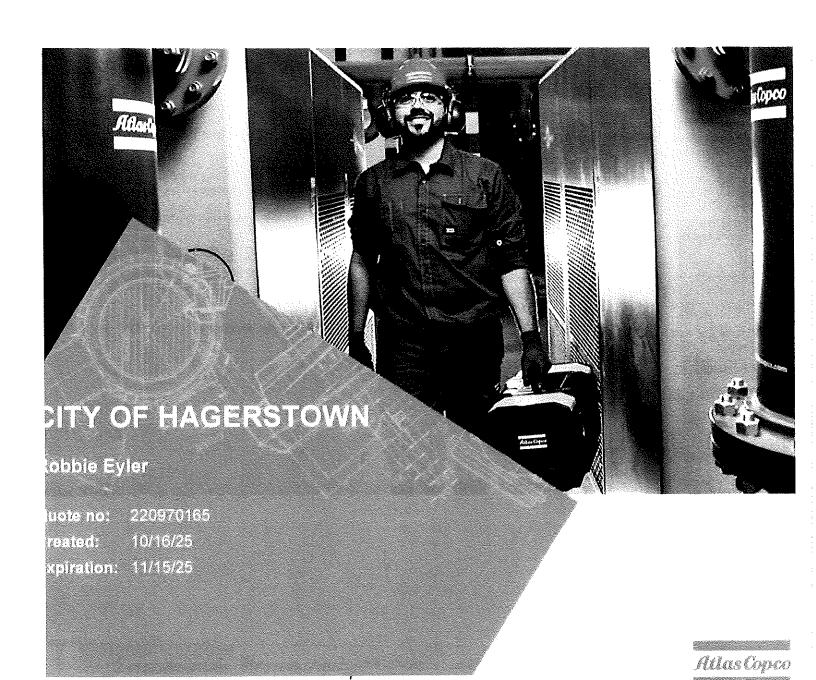

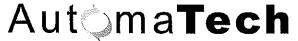

<u>Appendix 'A'</u> <u>Potterfield Pool Management Agreement</u>

This Agreement between _______(the Company) and the CITY OF HAGERSTOWN (City) is to provide for the operation and management by the Company of the Potterfield Pool and related amenities located at 730 Frederick Street in Hagerstown, MD ("the Pool"), in accordance with the specifications, conditions, and terms set forth herein.

- **1. TERM:** This Agreement, when executed by both parties, shall be in effect from January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2027 and shall automatically renew for three successive one (1) year terms beginning January 1, 2028 unless either party gives written notice 90 days prior to the conclusion of the then current term.
- 2. **SCHEDULE:** The Company shall meet the following milestones throughout the pool season:
 - February 19th Preseason meeting with City
 - April 30th Preseason meeting with City and finalize pool preseason preparation (Section 6) And deadline to apply for Health Department permits (Section 8),
 - May 8th Deadline for Health Department inspection, submitting to the City the managers' names (and contact information, pool status report due, and initial lifeguard schedule),
 - May 22nd -- Deadline for pool being fully ready for the public and submitting to the City the checklists, Emergency Action Plans and other operational documents
 - Saturday prior to Memorial Day first day of swimming
 - Labor Day Last day of swimming
 - Pooch Plunge Tuesday after Labor Day (when applicable)
 - October 1st Pool closing (Section 22)

Pool and sprayground (AKA splashpad) shall be permitted, open, and "swim ready" no later than **May 20**th of each year of the contract, and continuing through Labor Day weekend. Lifeguards shall be on duty beginning Memorial Day weekend, and continuing through Labor Day. Lifeguard hours and pool operating schedule shall be approved by the City of Hagerstown and shall be provided to the City for review prior to May 8th (Lifeguard Schedule).

- 3. ACCESS: The City will provide three sets of keys and access to the pool site no later than February 1. The Company shall keep and safeguard keys and release keys only to authorized personnel. If the City chooses to change locks at the pool during the term of this contract, three new sets of keys shall be provided to the City of Hagerstown.
- **4. ITEMS PROVIDED BY CITY:** The City agrees to furnish, at no cost to the Company, all of the following:
 - Water
 - Electricity
 - Receptacles for trash, garbage pick-up service
 - Telephone and internet
 - Pool operating equipment
 - Digital copy of past pool rules, checklists, and employee conduct expectations
 - Safety equipment backboard, ring buoy(s), rescue tube(s), Shepherd's hook(s), first aid kit, and rope with buoys
 - Paper products, pool house cleaning supplies, two (2) first aid kits and extra band-aids
 - One set of walkie-talkies (per season)
 - Automated external defibrillator
 - Mowing of the grass
 - Installation and care of the shade canopies

- Weekend security (security in addition to weekends will be provided at the City's sole discretion)
- Cashiers
- Concessions
- 5. **TELEPHONE:** The City shall be responsible for providing an operational telephone at least thirty (30) days prior to Pool opening. The phone shall be readily accessible to lifeguards and other personnel in the main office.
- 6. **OPENING:** Company agrees to complete all services required to make Pool "swim ready" by **May 12**th each year of the contract, including without limitation, the following where applicable:
 - By May 10th, provide the City a pre-opening "Pool Status" report including condition of Pool, equipment status, pump type(s) and status, general condition of Pool structure, issues that may prevent opening of the facility to the public and complete the following:
 - Clean Pool (bottom must be visible)
 - Clean Pool decking
 - Inspect chemical feed pumps
 - Inspect all filtration equipment
 - Inspect flow meters, pressure gauges, and valves
 - Start up and inspect sprayground
 - Install guard chairs and ladders if applicable
 - Clean bathhouse
 - Inspect water testing supplies
 - Fill Pool
 - Order, store, and inject all necessary chemicals to establish proper levels to meet all state, County,
 City, and other applicable requirements
 - Set out and clean pool deck furniture
 - Perform repair work as need and in compliance with Section 18 of this contract
 - Inspect all skimmers
 - Inspect vacuum system
 - Inspect return inlets
 - Inspect pump room valve system
 - Inspect all slides
- 7. **VANDALISM:** The City will respond to all after-hour alarms, and address issues promptly. The Company will respond to issues that occur during operating hours. The City agrees to pay reasonable additional charges to the Company for cleanup required as a result of vandalism.
- 8. **PERMITS:** The Company shall apply for and obtain from the local Health Department or any other regulatory agency, a swimming pool operation permit, sprayground and slide permits prior to **May 1st** of each year. These permits MUST be in the name of the City. The Company shall pay for, in advance, all fees associated with obtaining the permits. Cost of the permits should then be invoiced to the City along with a copy of each-permit. The Company shall advise and assist the City regarding the permits and will make any necessary repairs and take all steps required to satisfy Health Department requirements. These repairs shall be made in accordance with Section 18 of this contract. A copy of the permits MUST BE DELIVERED TO THE CITY no later than **May 8th**.
- 9. MINIMUM SAFETY STANDARDS: The Company shall bring the Pool into compliance with all applicable laws, codes, and regulations, including but not limited to, compliance with minimum standards. Payment for work and equipment to bring the Pool within minimum standards on the above items shall be the responsibility of the City.

- 10. WARRANTY: Company represents and warrants that it has specific knowledge of all applicable laws, codes, and regulations, whether State, County, Municipality, or otherwise, regarding the Pool operation and maintenance, including, without limitations, providing the required number of properly trained lifeguards and CPOs, and will ensure that its employees, agents, and other parties follow all applicable laws, codes, and regulations.
- **11. PERSONNEL:** All the Company's obligations under this agreement shall be carried out or satisfied by employees of the Company as follows:
 - The Company agrees to pay for all Company's employee wages, income tax withholdings, social security withholdings, State unemployment insurance, Federal unemployment insurance, and Worker's Compensation insurance.
 - The Company shall train all employees. Employees not performing up to the standards of the City will be promptly replaced by the Company upon request of the City.
 - Lifeguards employed by the Company shall have a Basic Life Guarding Certificate, a Lifeguard Training Certificate, or the equivalent, as well as CPR and First Aid.
 - Company employees shall go through the Company's orientation training, onsite training, and preseason meeting with the City.
 - Personnel will be trained in the area of blood borne pathogens and provided a blood borne pathogen exposure control kit.
 - The Company will provide a Certified Pool Operators (CPO) and experienced Pool Managers to supervise the staff and manage all Pool operations. Certified Pool Operators (CPO) shall be onsite during all hours when Pool is open.
 - Lifeguards shall have the authority to discipline swimmers and any and all other persons within the Pol, using their best judgment and sole discretion, consistent with the published and posted rules of the City and minimum safety standards as established herein. Company shall notify the City if a patron receives disciplinary action or is permanently removed from the Pool for the season.
 - Company's full time management staff will supervise personnel. Company supervisors shall inspect the City's facilities no less than two (2) times each week to check performance of personnel.
 - Company will typically invest substantial resources to train and convey information concerning operational techniques and management procedures to its employees at the Pool and the City acknowledges that such information and investment is a valuable asset of Company's business.
 - Pool staff shall wear professional uniforms, and be easily identifiable.

Lifeguards will be provided for the Monocacy Aquatic Club (MAC). The number of guards for private parties to be determined on a case-by-case basis are included in above estimate

The Company must provide adequate staffing to meet minimum lifeguard staffing requirements as established by the County and State Health Department requirements. Based on the configuration of the Pool, we require the following minimum staffing levels:

In addition, staff will need to monitor activities at the sprayground and enforce established rules.

12. DAILY SCHEDULE:

The following are the typical daily schedules:

- 13. **POOL PARTIES**: The company shall charge the City-approved user fee and forward the payments to the City for the reservations in the month prior. The City will pay the lifeguard and manager time on a per hour basis when included in the itemized monthly invoice.
- **14. OPERATIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES:** Company employees shall be responsible for performing the following acts in accordance with all applicable laws, codes and regulations:
 - Life guarding, including but not limited to the main pool, sprayground, slides, climbing wall and future pool amenities.
 - Checking water chemistry and recording readings a minimum of three (3) times per day.
 - Maintaining chemical balance of pool(s) water.
 - Back washing filtration system as needed.

- Cleaning pump system strainer baskets.
- Cleaning bathhouse and bathrooms daily and inspecting the same on an hourly basis.
- Cleaning swimming pool(s) deck daily.
- Vacuuming pool as needed. In general, this should result in an overall vacuuming of the pool about two (2) times per week or more often if needed to keep the pool(s) clean.
- Hourly picking up trash and litter. Emptying trash and recyclable receptacles daily and placing containers in the proper location for collection on the appropriate day(s).
- Straightening and cleaning deck furniture.
- Company shall be on standby for alarms and promptly answer all alarm calls and address issue.
- · Maintain mechanical equipment.
- At the end of the day, lock and secure all gates and doors. Activate alarm system.
- Implementation of approved Emergency Action Plan.
- Inspect slides, sprayground, rock wall and other features daily.
- Company shall notify the City in writing within 24 hours if an injury or safety violation is reported to the Company by patrons.
- Provide City any Health Department inspections during the pool season within 24 hours of inspection.
- Report and document all action that may jeopardize the spirit and content of this Agreement.
- Enforce pool rules, staff code of conduct and checklists. Copies of prior documents are attached as Attachment 2. See attached as a reference and that Company shall develop its own rules, staff code of conduct, and checklists and provide them to the City on or before May 20th of each year.
- 15. INCLEMENT WEATHER/TEMPORARY CLOSINGS: The Company and City shall develop and agree to criteria for closing the pool, and methods to notify the public via various forms. On days when there is inclement weather, the Company shall keep one (1) lifeguard on duty throughout the scheduled lifeguard hours to handle public inquiries. Weather related closings of the pool shall be at the discretion of the City. Temporary shut-down due to fecal, vomit or thunder/lighting should be handled by Company in accordance with Health Department and Center for Disease Control guidelines.
 - NO CHANGE IN DATES OF OPERATION OR HOURS OF OPERATION CAN BE ACCEPTED UNLESS WRITTEN AUTHORIZATION IS RECEIVED FROM THE CITY OF HAGERSTOWN
- 16. WATER QUALITY: At no time shall the water chemistry cause a failure of permission to operate the pool as granted by the State, County, City, or other applicable regulatory body. In the event permission is revoked to operate the pool due to poor water quality, the City will assess penalties as listed in Section 25 below. All of the foregoing not withstanding however, the Company shall be excused from maintaining water quality established herein and the City shall not be entitled to a refund in the event of any Act of God, interference by City or other circumstances beyond the control of the Company make such maintenance impossible.
- 17. CHEMICALS AND SUPPLIES: The Company agrees to supply at its own expense all chemicals for safe and clean pool water throughout the term of this contract including, but not limited to sodium hydrochloride, cyanuric acid, muriatic acid, sodium bicarbonate, soda ash, and calcium chloride. The Company shall monitor the chemicals and maintain acceptable water quality. The Company agrees to supply water test kits and first aid kits.
- 18. **REPAIR WORK:** The Company shall stand ready to perform any repair work necessary during the term of this Agreement. However, the City shall have the option of using another contractor for repair work or complete the work with City staff. When a repair issue presents itself:
 - Company shall promptly provide detailed estimate of costs separating materials and labor
 - After approval in writing by the City, the Company shall promptly perform the necessary actions and invoice the City.

- Any repairs required as the result of error on the part of the Company shall be paid for by the Company at no cost to the City.
- All invoices for repair work must be completely itemized and received within ninety (90) days of the completion of the repair.
- If any repair work involves draining and refilling of the pool, the Company must refill the pool using a water hydrant and a hydrant meter, or use a water line that does not have sewer charges attached to it. Failure to do so shall result in the Company being billed for the sewer charges through a deduction on the next payment.
- **19. INSURANCE/LIABILITY:** The Company shall maintain and keep in full force from an insurance company licensed to do business in the State of Maryland the following coverages:
 - Worker's Compensation insurance covering all persons engaged on behalf of the Company in the performance of the terms of this Agreement.
 - Commercial General Liability insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 for each accident and \$1,000,000 for each person. This may be included in the umbrella portion of the policy.
 - Professional Liability insurance on the lifeguards in the amount of \$1,000,000.
 - Company agrees to supply copies of certificates of insurance to the City verifying the abovementioned insurance coverage. Company agrees to list City on Company's policies as an "Additional Insured" of the Company's General Liability insurance. A copy of the current policy showing the above limits and listing the City as additional insured must be delivered to the City or City's Agent at the time this Agreement is executed.

20. MISCELLANEOUS:

- The Company shall display a sign on the pool premises designating the responsibility to the Company for the pool staff with contact information.
- City agrees to communicate any comments, suggestions, or complaints concerning the pool, pool staff, or management service directly to the Company Management as well as the Pool Manager.
- During the term of the contract, applicable minimum wage may increase. As of January 1, 2024, the minimum wage in Maryland (for employers with 15 or more employees) is the following:

Current	\$15.00/hour

If State-mandated increases go into effect, the Company may present to the City an Amendment to this Agreement with the additional charges for the PER HOUR lifeguard rate (item "B" of the proposal). City will have thirty (30) days in which to accept or reject the Amendment. If the City does not accept the Amendment, the existing Agreement is voidable at the Company's option.

- 21. PRE/POST WALK THROUGH: The Company shall invite the City to join them in a complete inspection of the City's facility prior to opening and after the completion of all closing tasks. It shall be the obligation of the Company to provide the City with a detailed and specific account of the current condition as well as potential short term and long term needs of the pool. Upon inspection, the Company shall provide a written report to the City. At the City's request, the Company will perform any repairs listed in the report, in accordance with Section 18 of this Agreement.
- 22. CLOSING: Unless the City elects otherwise, the pool shall be considered closed to swimmers at the end of Labor Day each year. The Company shall perform all the following duties as soon after Labor Day as may be feasible, but in no case any later than October 1st.
 - · Lower water level below skimmers.
 - Drain all pumps and lint strainers.
 - Back wash and drain filter tanks.
 - Open all valves to appropriate settings.
 - Winterize sprayground

- Clean and store City's deck furniture.
- Remove and store skimmer parts.
- Cover all skimmers with gizmos to prevent the buildup of rain water.
- Remove and store all moveable ladders and lifeguard chairs.
- Drain and store hoses.
- Lubricate filter system valves and grease motor bearings.
- Add winterization chemicals to pool to retard algae growth.
- Prepare pool and pool plumbing lines for freeze protection. Company agrees to use common and accepted winterization techniques, but assumes no responsibility for freeze damage if all the proper procedures are followed. Company will inject anti-freeze in skimmers and related fixtures.
- Request a walk-through inspection with City's staff.

City will complete all "fresh water winterizing" in the pool house

- **23. PRICE PROPOSAL:** The Company hereby proposes to perform the work and services as set forth above by this Agreement, specifications, conditions, and terms as set forth herein as follows:
 - A. LUMP SUM annual fee for contract management, opening, closing, profit and overhead
 - B. PER HOUR rate for management and lifeguards
 - C. LUMP SUM annual fee for chemicals and supplies provided by Company

24. PAYMENTS:

Based upon the proposal above and upon receipt of a monthly invoice with adequate documentation, the City will make monthly payments to Company as follows:

- A. 1/8th of annual contract management fee (months of March-October inclusive)
- B. Lifeguard hours *actually used and documented* from the previous month, including pool rentals (provide weekly listing)
- C. 1/4th of annual chemical and supplies fee (months of May, June, July and August only)
- D. Less pool rental user fees (Section 13) and/or liquidated damages (Section 25) from the previous month

City will process issue payment within 30 days of receipt of satisfactory invoices and documentation

25. FAILURE TO PERFORM/LIQUIDATED DAMAGES:

- The City will deduct from funds owed Company the amount of \$500 per day for each calendar day after May 10 that the pool is not ready for Health Department inspection or should fail any Health Department inspection. This will be null and void if the delay is directly caused by the City or its contractors.
- The City will deduct from funds owed Company the amount of \$500 per day for each calendar day after May 10 that the pool manager is not hired and trained.
- The City will deduct from funds owed Company the amount of \$500 per day for each calendar day after May 20 that the pool is not ready for public opening as determined by the City. This will be null and void if the delay is directly caused by the City or its contractors.
- The City will deduct from funds owed Company the amount of \$500 per day for each calendar day throughout the season that there is inadequate number of guards that the pool cannot be opened, or pool amenities cannot be safely operated.
- The City will deduct from the funds owed Company the amount of \$500 per day for each calendar day of the operating season the pool is not ready for public opening as determined by the City. This will be null and void if the delay is directly caused by the City or its contractors.

26. CANCELLATION: The City shall have the right to cancel this Agreement with cause immediately upon the commission of an egregious act by the Company, and with or without cause upon thirty (30) day's written notice to the Company. Upon termination, the City shall be entitled to a cancellation fee computed as follows:

Company shall pay the City \$500 for each day for the remainder of the season, until such time as the City shall find replacement contractor to operate the Pool. Payment of the fee in full shall be due within ten (10) days from the date a replacement contractor begins operations at the Pool or the end of the Pool season, whichever shall occur sooner.

- **28. GOVERNING LAW:** This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Maryland, without regard to its conflicts of laws principles.
- 29. ENTIRE AGREEMENT, MODIFICATION, AND BINDING EFFECT: This Agreement (inclusive of Attachments 1 and 2) constitutes the entire agreement of the parties and supersedes any prior agreements, understandings, or negotiations, written or oral. This Agreement may not be modified or amended except in writing, executed by both parties hereto. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the City and the Company and so their respective heirs, successors, and assigns.
- **30. ASSIGNMENT:** Neither party shall assign this agreement without the express written consent of the other party.
- 31. SEVERABILITY: If any term or provision of this Agreement or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall, to any extent, be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement, or the application of any such term or provision to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby and each term and provision of this Agreement shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- 32. NONWAIVER: The City and the Company agree that no failure to exercise and no delay in exercising any right, power, or privilege under this Agreement on the part of either party shall operate as a waiver of any right, power, or privilege under this Agreement.
- **33. NO DISCRIMINATION:** No action shall be taken by the City, or the Company which would discriminate against any person on the basis of race, creed, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status, or disability.
- 34. INDEMNIFICATION: Company hereby covenants and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the City from and against any and all losses, damages, costs, and expenses, including, without limitation, attorney's fees and court costs, that may be incurred or suffered by the City as a result of any claim, including, without limitation, a claim for negligence being asserted against the City by any party which arises from, results from, relates directly or indirectly to, or is in any way whatsoever connected with the Company's operation and management of the pool and its obligation and duties under this Agreement.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move to award the bids for gasoline and diesel fuel transport deliveries under four (4) separate contracts to the responsive, responsible bidders who submitted the lowest bids. Item No. 7 of the bid will be contingent upon individual departmental requirements.

- 1. Contract for gasoline tank-wagon deliveries to AC&T Company, Inc. of Hagerstown, MD, at the unit bidder factor prices as stated in its bid dated October 21, 2025.
- 2. Contract for gasoline transport deliveries to Petroleum Traders Corporation of Fort Wayne, IN., at the unit bidder factor prices as stated in its bid dated October 21, 2025.
- 3. Contract for diesel tank-wagon deliveries to AC&T Company, Inc. of Hagerstown, MD, at the unit bidder factor prices as stated in its bid dated October 21, 2025.
- 4. Contract for diesel transport deliveries to Petroleum Traders Corporation of Fort Wayne, IN., at the unit bidder factor prices stated in its bid dated October 21, 2025.

REPORT-IN-BRIEF: The following tabulations listed below were made from the bids received on October 22, 2025, based on the bid factor submitted for the contract period that is tentatively to begin on December 1, 2025, and end on November 30, 2026. The contracts are for a one (1) year term with no option to renew. These are requirements contracts, and the County guarantees neither a maximum nor a minimum quantity.

The Invitation to Bid was advertised on the State of Maryland's eMMA "eMaryland Marketplace Advantage" website and the County's new online bidding website (Ionwave/Euna). Eight (8) persons/companies registered/downloaded the bid document online and seven (7) bids were received. The bids were evaluated based on the bidder's bid factor; bids were submitted as per the attached bid tabulation.

DISCUSSION: The contract requirements for the City of Hagerstown, Washington County Public Schools and Hagerstown Community College are also included in the above recommendations. Those entities will also make their own formal contract awards.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funds are available in various departmental operating budgets for this service.

This is an especially important service for those buildings that require Joint Commission Compliance.

COOLANT SYSTEM MAINTENANCE: Replace Belts, Hoses, Coolants, and Thermostats:

The Automatic Transfer Switch serves as the most critical element of the backup power generation system. If the transfer switch is inoperable, your entire system is down. It is highly recommended to include transfer switch cleaning as part of your maintenance plan. To ensure your ATS is in optimum working condition, our tech will provide thorough inspection, cleaning, disassemble & lubrication of the transfer mechanism as well as tightening of all load connections.

Technicians use an infrared camera to detect hot spots caused by defects in connections and components. The conditions detectable by an infrared inspection include loose/deteriorated connections, overloads, open circuits, unbalanced loads, inductive heating, harmonics, and defective equipment. Exclusions

Unless otherwise stated in the Agreement or Special Provisions as being specifically included the following are excluded:

Main power to the equipment disconnect, ductwork and insulation, any Utility (electric, gas, water, or sewer) wiring, crane services, temporary cooling, explosion proof equipment, water treatment/chemicals, boiler inspection certifications, any asbestos removal, an proprietary controls, changes to safety or work rules due to changes in regulations or changes in Customer interpretation of regulations or changes in Customer enforcement of regulations, equipment structural supports, oil storage tanks and cleaning interior of system(s) ductwork.

All equipment, components and supporting systems NOT specifically listed on the Asset Maintenance Schedule. Loss of, partial failure of or insufficient capacity of utilities such as, but not limited to, electrical service, open circuit breakers or fuses external to those listed on the equipment list, water service, fuel sources, or other building faults and malfunctions. External power wiring, circuit breakers, and disconnects supplying electrical service to the listed equipment. Refinishing, repair, replacement, cleaning, or modification of duct work louvers, cabinetry, housings, bases, mountings, foundations, supporting structures, trim or decorations. All emergency freight and expediting charges. Additional maintenance and adjustments required by the Customer. The cost of providing a rental generator while the permanent generator is being repaired. Maintenance on a Fire Pump covers the DIESEL ENGINE ONLY. Service Contractor is not responsible for damage to roofing as a result of leaks, equipment failure, or component failure; however, we will make every effort to protect the area while services are performed.

Clarifications

Customer shall permit Service Contractor free and timely access to areas and the Covered Equipment and allow Service Contractor to start and stop the Covered Equipment as necessary to perform required services. Customer is responsible for providing adequate and legal parking arrangements for our technicians during service visits. This includes ensuring that suitable parking is available in close proximity to the industrial generators and that access routes are free from obstruction. Any costs incurred by Service Contractor for delays (e.g., labor hours), additional costs or fees, and/or penalties (e.g., parking fines) incurred due to the lack of suitable parking or site access will be the responsibility of Customer. In cases where specialized access or permits are required, Customer must arrange and pay for such access or permits in advance to avoid service interruptions.

Used oil, coolant, and filters removed from contracted equipment is recycled utilizing a third-party vendor in accordance with EPA guidelines.

The Agreement price is conditioned upon the Covered Equipment being in a maintainable condition. If the initial inspection or initial seasonal start-up indicates repairs are required, a firm quotation will be submitted for Customer's approval. Should Customer not authorize the repairs and service recommended by the Service Contractor, the Service Contractor may either remove the unacceptable system(s) component(s) or part(s) from the scope of this Agreement and adjust the annual Agreement price or terminate this Agreement.

This Agreement applies only to the maintainable/moving components of the system(s). Repair or replacement of non-maintainable/non-moving parts such as duct work, boiler shell and tubes, cabinets, boiler refractory material, heat exchangers, evaporator or condenser coils, refrigerant (piping and leaks), main power service and electrical wiring, electrical boards, gas valves, structural supports, tube bundles, oil storage tanks, and other similar items are excluded from labor and parts coverage.

This Agreement does not include responsibility for the design of the system, obsolescence, safety test, removal and reinstallation of valve bodies and dampers, repair or replacement necessitated by freezing weather, electrical power failure, low voltage, burned-out





main or branch fuses, low water pressure, vandalism, misuse or abuse of the system(s), negligence of others (including Customer), failure of Customer to properly operate the system(s) requirements of governmental regulatory or insurance agencies, or other causes beyond control of Service Provider.

Our normal business hours are from 7:00 AM to 4:00 PM, Monday through Friday. All normal service and maintenance will be performed during these regular business hours. Cancelled service calls will be billed for a minimum of one hour.

Should the Customer require service during a time other than the above stated business hours, the Customer shall pay the service contractor the additional overtime portion of the normal service rates. Normal overtime is time and a half or the normal service rate times 1.5. Saturday from 5:00 PM to Monday 2:00 AM and holidays are double the time. If the selected maintenance agreement includes labor cost, then the Customer must pay only the overtime portion of the labor.

The Customer will be responsible for any price increases that the Service Contractor incurs because of any tariffs imposed on the equipment and materials reflected in its scope of work, including any tariffs on any component parts of the equipment and materials. In the event the Service Contractor incurs any such tariff-related price increase, the Customer will issue a change order to the Service Contractor to adjust the contract price to reflect the tariff-related price increase.

The Service Contractor, as a convenience to the Customer, accepts payments via most major credit cards. In the event the Customer wishes to pay Service Contractor by credit card, Customer agrees to reimburse the Service Contractor a surcharge of 4% of the amount of the invoice being charged (or to the extent permissible by law) if the Customer uses any major credit card, and the Customer authorizes Service Contractor to add the applicable surcharge to the credit card transaction.





Select Plus Terms and Conditions

Throughout this Agreement:

Hagerstown Water Department shall be known as the Customer.

Fidelity Power Systems shall be known as the Service Contractor.

These terms and conditions of the Agreement (the "Agreement") and all of the sections included, are integral parts of and form the Agreement between the Service Contractor and the Customer. In the event the Customer seeks to have the Service Contractor enter into a separate written contract for the scope of work of this Agreement, then: (1) the separate written contract must be acceptable to the Contractor; (2) the entire Agreement shall be attached to and incorporated by reference in such separate written contract; (3) to the extent that there is a conflict between the terms and conditions of the Agreement and the terms and conditions of the separate written contract, the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall control; and (4) if the Contractor and the Customer are unable to agree upon a mutually acceptable separate written contract, the Contractor shall have the right to rescind the quote included with this Agreement without liability to the Contractor.

The Service Contractor accepts the care of the equipment listed in the Asset Maintenance Schedule (the "Covered Equipment") as applicable to the Program. The Covered Equipment shall be maintained in the condition that exists at the beginning of the Term. Any defective components, excessive wear, maladjustments, improper installation, improper design, service by others, improper operation, or misapplication, shall not be considered the responsibility of the Service Contractor, other than normal Preventive Maintenance. Repairs and service required in restoring the Covered Equipment's capacity, reliability, design efficiency, or other shortcomings shall only be repaired with authorization and invoiced at normal service rates in addition to vehicle and other related service charges.

The Customer agrees to employ the Service Contractor exclusively for the service and repair work of the Covered Equipment and promptly notify the Service Contractor of any condition of the Covered Equipment that is unusual or that may adversely affect its operation and reliability. Any alterations, additions, adjustments, or repairs made by others, unless authorized or agreed upon by the Service Contractor in writing, will be cause for Service Contractor to terminate or renegotiate the Service Contractor's obligation under this Agreement. This Agreement shall not include maintenance, repairs, service or replacements necessitated by any loss or damage resulting from any cause beyond the control of the Service Contractor, including but not limited to damage or loss due to lack of water, freezing, loss or insufficient electric power or fuel source, hail, flood, windstorm, excessive rain, snow, freezing weather, lightning, earthquake, theft, fire, riots of any origin, strikes, wars, misuse, negligence by person(s) other than those representing the Service Contractor, vandalism, acts of government, building code requirements, insurance company requirements, unauthorized adjustments or repairs, or any other peril or act of God. The cost of all repairs, modifications, or alterations necessitated by the above shall be the responsibility of the Customer and payable to the Service Contractor at Service Contractor's current service rates in addition to vehicle and other related service charges.

All reasonable efforts shall be extended in performing the service as requested by the Customer, but the Service Contractor shall not be liable for any losses or consequential damage that arise out of delays, misuse by the Customer, or the Customer's agents or employees. Replacement and installation of equipment, components, or accessories that fail to provide satisfactory performance due to obsolescence or design conditions are not included in the scope of the Agreement.

The Customer agrees to pay the Service Contractor as set forth in the Agreement. The terms of payment for all other invoices submitted by the Service Contractor are net thirty (30) days from the Customer's receipt of such invoice. The Customer's obligation to pay the Contractor shall not be contingent upon or delayed by prior payment of a third-party, including but not limited to any





insurance companies or the Customer's client. In the event that the Customer objects to the charges in any invoice, the Customer shall notify the Contractor in writing the basis for such objection within fifteen (15) days of its receipt of such invoice, and if the Customer fails to provide written notice within such timeframe, the Customer's objection shall be deemed waived, and the invoice shall be deemed due and payable for the amount of such invoice. Unless the Agreement specifically states otherwise, the prices in this Agreement do not include sales tax, and to the extent sales tax is applicable to any services, materials and/or equipment, such sales tax will be listed separately on the Service Contractor's invoices, and the Customer agrees to pay for all applicable sales taxes. The prices in this Agreement do not include any costs associated with using any invoicing software, portals or services required by the Customer or of any requirement by the Customer for the Service Contractor to procure additional insurance or higher limits of insurance than are typically carried by the Service Contractor, and to the extent there are any costs incurred by the Service Contractor to comply with such requirements, the Customer agrees to reimburse the Service Contractor for such costs. The Customer further agrees to pay finance charges of 11/2 % per month for invoices not paid within 30 days of the invoice date. In the event that the Customer fails to pay the Service Contractor in accordance with the agreed payment terms: (1) the Service Contractor may, at its sole discretion, stop all work under this Agreement and any other Agreement between the Service Contractor and the Customer until such time as the Customer's account is brought current; and (2) the Customer agrees to reimburse the Service Contractor for any and all costs of collection of the outstanding balance, including but not limited to the Service Contractor's attorneys' fees, expert fees, court costs and any other legal expenses that the Service Contractor incurs, even if the costs of collection exceed the outstanding balance. The Service Contractor and the Customer agree that in the event a dispute arises with respect to this Agreement, such dispute shall be resolved in a court of competent jurisdiction in the county in which Service Contractor's home office is located and this Agreement shall be governed and interpreted by the laws of the state in which Service Contractor's home office is located, exclusive of its conflict of laws principles. THE SERVICE CONTRACTOR AND THE CUSTOMER EXPRESSLY CONSENT TO THE PERSONAL JURISDICTION OF THE AFORMENTIONED STATE, AGREE TO THE AFOREMENTIONED COUNTY AS THE APPROPRIATE VENUE FOR DISPUTES, AND IRREVOCABLY WAIVE TRIAL BY JURY IN ANY ACTION, PROCEEDING, OR COUNTERCLAIM, WHETHER AT LAW OR IN EQUITY, BROUGHT BY EITHER PARTY IN CONNECTION WITH THIS AGREEMENT.

Where the Service Contractor renders service for the Customer other than those services specified in the Program, the Customer agrees to pay for such services at the Service Contractor's current service rates in addition to vehicle and other related service charges. Loss of time or productivity due to unexpected events that may restrict or limit access to the Covered Equipment, associated equipment of components shall be invoiced at the current service rates in addition to vehicle and other related service charges. The fees and surcharges set forth in this Agreement are estimates based on the market conditions at the time that this Agreement was entered. Service Contractor will use reasonable efforts to maintain the fees and surcharges as estimated in this Agreement. However, due to severe fluctuations in material, equipment and fuel costs, Service Contractor reserves its right to modify the fees and surcharges during the term of the Agreement with regard to any services rendered for the Customer, other than those services specified in the Program.

The term of this Agreement (the "Term") is designated on the signature page of the Agreement. The Customer and the Service Contractor agree that the Term or any renewal term thereafter shall automatically renew for a one- year period ("Renewal Term") under the same terms and conditions of the Agreement, and subject to adjustment at the commencement of each Renewal Term to reflect increases in labor, material and other costs, unless the Agreement is terminated in writing by either the Customer or the Service Contractor no less than thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of the current Term or Renewal Term. If any of the rates to be charged by the Service Contractor and/or vehicle and other related service charges for the upcoming Renewal Term will change, the Service Contractor will notify the Customer of such changes in writing.

The Service Contractor's liability hereunder shall not exceed the annual cost of this Agreement, except in the event where damage to the Covered Equipment has been caused by the Service Contractor while performing routine maintenance or service, and then only to the extent of the replacement parts and installation thereof. In no event shall the Service Contractor be liable for consequential damages or losses, including but not limited to loss of profits, loss of use of the Covered Equipment, loss of the use of any associated





or supported equipment, high or unusual utility cost, investment cost of substitute facilities, or rental of equipment. During the Term of the Agreement, the Service Contractor agrees to either repair or replace any defective work performed by the Service Contractor. The determination as to whether such work is to be repaired or replaced is within the sole discretion of the Service Contractor. Unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the Service Contractor and the Customer, upon the termination of this Agreement or the expiration of the Term, whichever occurs first, the Service Contractor shall have no further obligations to repair or replace work performed during the Term, and Customer shall be responsible for maintaining the Covered Equipment upon the termination of this Agreement or the expiration of the Term, whichever occurs first. Any warranty of the materials, parts and equipment installed by Service Contractor

shall be subject to the manufacturers' standard warranty terms, if any, and Customer's exclusive remedy with respect to any claims of defects in such materials, parts or equipment shall be governed by the manufacturers' standard warranty. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Customer shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Service Contractor, its agent and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses and expenses (including but not limited to attorneys' fees) arising out of or resulting from the performance of work hereunder, provided that such claim, damage, loss or expense is caused in whole or in part by an active or passive act or omission of the Customer, anyone directly or indirectly employed by the Customer, or anyone for whose acts the Customer may be liable, regardless of whether it is caused in part by the negligence of the Service Contractor. Further and notwithstanding the preceding sentence, the Service Contractor shall be held harmless by the Customer and shall not be liable to the Customer for any claims, liabilities, damages, losses and expenses related to mold or the creation of mold at the Customer's location(s) and shall have no obligation to treat, identify or remove such mold.

The Customer agrees to not solicit or hire employees of Service Contractor and/or the Service Contractor's subcontractors for itself and/or for any corporation, which Customer now represents or with which Customer now or may later be affiliated during the term of this Agreement and for a period of one year after the termination of the Agreement.

PANDEMIC AND EPIDEMIC PRECAUTIONS

The Customer and the Service Contractor acknowledge that pandemics and/or epidemics may severely impact the location where the services will be performed. As a result, in the event of a pandemic and/or epidemic, Federal, State and Local guidelines and requirements may be imposed and modified, which may impact the timing and cost of the services under the Agreement.

The Customer and the Service Contractor agree that: (1) the Customer and the Service Contractor will both use commercially reasonable efforts with respect to the services under the Agreement; (2) the Customer and the Service Contractor and their respective employees, agents and representatives will comply with applicable Federal, State and Local government quarantines, shelter-in-place orders, regulations, executive orders and/or directives, including but not limited to any recommendations or requirements of the Centers for Disease Control, U.S. Department of Labor, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, and/or any comparable State or Local agencies (collectively, "Pandemic/Epidemic Requirements"); (3) the Customer and the Service Contractor will both use commercially reasonable efforts to keep each other informed of pertinent updates or developments regarding their obligations to comply with Pandemic/Epidemic Requirements; and (4) if the Service Contractor's performance of the services under the Agreement is delayed, suspended and/or effected by Pandemic/Epidemic Requirements and/or by their direct or indirect impacts, the Service Contractor shall be entitled to adjustments to the schedule and/or the prices under the Agreement, provided the Service Contractor notifies the Customer within a reasonable period of time after the Service Contractor learns of the delay, suspension and/or effect.

Exclusions

Unless otherwise stated in the Agreement or Special Provisions as being specifically included the following are excluded:

Main power to the equipment disconnect, ductwork and insulation, any Utility (electric, gas, water, or sewer) wiring, crane services, temporary cooling, explosion proof equipment, water treatment/chemicals, boiler inspection certifications, any asbestos removal, an proprietary controls, changes to safety or work rules due to changes in regulations or changes in Customer interpretation of regulations or changes in Customer enforcement of regulations, equipment structural supports, oil storage tanks and cleaning interior of system(s) ductwork.

All equipment, components and supporting systems NOT specifically listed on the Asset Maintenance Schedule. Loss of, partial failure of or insufficient capacity of utilities such as, but not limited to, electrical service, open circuit breakers or fuses external to those listed on the equipment list, water service, fuel sources, or other building faults and malfunctions. External power wiring, circuit breakers, and disconnects supplying electrical service to the listed equipment. Refinishing, repair, replacement, cleaning, or modification of duct work louvers, cabinetry, housings, bases, mountings, foundations, supporting structures, trim or decorations. All emergency freight and expediting charges. Additional maintenance and adjustments required by the Customer. The cost of providing a rental generator while the permanent generator is being repaired. Maintenance on a Fire Pump covers the DIESEL ENGINE ONLY. Service Contractor is not responsible for damage to roofing as a result of leaks, equipment failure, or component failure; however, we will make every effort to protect the area while services are performed.

Clarifications

Customer shall permit Service Contractor free and timely access to areas and the Covered Equipment and allow Service Contractor to start and stop the Covered Equipment as necessary to perform required services. Customer is responsible for providing adequate and legal parking arrangements for our technicians during service visits. This includes ensuring that suitable parking is available in close proximity to the industrial generators and that access routes are free from obstruction. Any costs incurred by Service Contractor for delays (e.g., labor hours), additional costs or fees, and/or penalties (e.g., parking fines) incurred due to the lack of suitable parking or site access will be the responsibility of Customer. In cases where specialized access or permits are required, Customer must arrange and pay for such access or permits in advance to avoid service interruptions.

Used oil, coolant, and filters removed from contracted equipment is recycled utilizing a third-party vendor in accordance with EPA guidelines.

The Agreement price is conditioned upon the Covered Equipment being in a maintainable condition. If the initial inspection or initial seasonal start-up indicates repairs are required, a firm quotation will be submitted for Customer's approval. Should Customer not authorize the repairs and service recommended by the Service Contractor, the Service Contractor may either remove the unacceptable system(s) component(s) or part(s) from the scope of this Agreement and adjust the annual Agreement price or terminate this Agreement.

This Agreement applies only to the maintainable/moving components of the system(s). Repair or replacement of non-maintainable/non-moving parts such as duct work, boiler shell and tubes, cabinets, boiler refractory material, heat exchangers, evaporator or condenser coils, refrigerant (piping and leaks), main power service and electrical wiring, electrical boards, gas valves, structural supports, tube bundles, oil storage tanks, and other similar items are excluded from labor and parts coverage.

This Agreement does not include responsibility for the design of the system, obsolescence, safety test, removal and reinstallation of valve bodies and dampers, repair or replacement necessitated by freezing weather, electrical power failure, low voltage, burned-out





main or branch fuses, low water pressure, vandalism, misuse or abuse of the system(s), negligence of others (including Customer), failure of Customer to properly operate the system(s) requirements of governmental regulatory or insurance agencies, or other causes beyond control of Service Provider.

Our normal business hours are from 7:00 AM to 4:00 PM, Monday through Friday. All normal service and maintenance will be performed during these regular business hours. Cancelled service calls will be billed for a minimum of one hour.

Should the Customer require service during a time other than the above stated business hours, the Customer shall pay the service contractor the additional overtime portion of the normal service rates. Normal overtime is time and a half or the normal service rate times 1.5. Saturday from 5:00 PM to Monday 2:00 AM and holidays are double the time. If the selected maintenance agreement includes labor cost, then the Customer must pay only the overtime portion of the labor.

The Customer will be responsible for any price increases that the Service Contractor incurs because of any tariffs imposed on the equipment and materials reflected in its scope of work, including any tariffs on any component parts of the equipment and materials. In the event the Service Contractor incurs any such tariff-related price increase, the Customer will issue a change order to the Service Contractor to adjust the contract price to reflect the tariff-related price increase.

The Service Contractor, as a convenience to the Customer, accepts payments via most major credit cards. In the event the Customer wishes to pay Service Contractor by credit card, Customer agrees to reimburse the Service Contractor a surcharge of 4% of the amount of the invoice being charged (or to the extent permissible by law) if the Customer uses any major credit card, and the Customer authorizes Service Contractor to add the applicable surcharge to the credit card transaction.





Select Plus Terms and Conditions

Hagerstown Water Department shall be known as the Customer.

Fidelity Power Systems shall be known as the Service Contractor.

These terms and conditions of the Agreement (the "Agreement") and all of the sections included, are integral parts of and form the Agreement between the Service Contractor and the Customer. In the event the Customer seeks to have the Service Contractor enter into a separate written contract for the scope of work of this Agreement, then: (1) the separate written contract must be acceptable to the Contractor; (2) the entire Agreement shall be attached to and incorporated by reference in such separate written contract; (3) to the extent that there is a conflict between the terms and conditions of the Agreement and the terms and conditions of the separate written contract, the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall control; and (4) if the Contractor and the Customer are unable to agree upon a mutually acceptable separate written contract, the Contractor shall have the right to rescind the quote included with this Agreement without liability to the Contractor.

The Service Contractor accepts the care of the equipment listed in the Asset Maintenance Schedule (the "Covered Equipment") as applicable to the Program. The Covered Equipment shall be maintained in the condition that exists at the beginning of the Term. Any defective components, excessive wear, maladjustments, improper installation, improper design, service by others, improper operation, or misapplication, shall not be considered the responsibility of the Service Contractor, other than normal Preventive Maintenance. Repairs and service required in restoring the Covered Equipment's capacity, reliability, design efficiency, or other shortcomings shall only be repaired with authorization and invoiced at normal service rates in addition to vehicle and other related service charges.

The Customer agrees to employ the Service Contractor exclusively for the service and repair work of the Covered Equipment and promptly notify the Service Contractor of any condition of the Covered Equipment that is unusual or that may adversely affect its operation and reliability. Any alterations, additions, adjustments, or repairs made by others, unless authorized or agreed upon by the Service Contractor in writing, will be cause for Service Contractor to terminate or renegotiate the Service Contractor's obligation under this Agreement. This Agreement shall not include maintenance, repairs, service or replacements necessitated by any loss or damage resulting from any cause beyond the control of the Service Contractor, including but not limited to damage or loss due to lack of water, freezing, loss or insufficient electric power or fuel source, hail, flood, windstorm, excessive rain, snow, freezing weather, lightning, earthquake, theft, fire, riots of any origin, strikes, wars, misuse, negligence by person(s) other than those representing the Service Contractor, vandalism, acts of government, building code requirements, insurance company requirements, unauthorized adjustments or repairs, or any other peril or act of God. The cost of all repairs, modifications, or alterations necessitated by the above shall be the responsibility of the Customer and payable to the Service Contractor at Service Contractor's current service rates in addition to vehicle and other related service charges.

All reasonable efforts shall be extended in performing the service as requested by the Customer, but the Service Contractor shall not be liable for any losses or consequential damage that arise out of delays, misuse by the Customer, or the Customer's agents or employees. Replacement and installation of equipment, components, or accessories that fail to provide satisfactory performance due to obsolescence or design conditions are not included in the scope of the Agreement.

The Customer agrees to pay the Service Contractor as set forth in the Agreement. The terms of payment for all other invoices submitted by the Service Contractor are net thirty (30) days from the Customer's receipt of such invoice. The Customer's obligation to pay the Contractor shall not be contingent upon or delayed by prior payment of a third-party, including but not limited to any





insurance companies or the Customer's client. In the event that the Customer objects to the charges in any invoice, the Customer shall notify the Contractor in writing the basis for such objection within fifteen (15) days of its receipt of such invoice, and if the Customer fails to provide written notice within such timeframe, the Customer's objection shall be deemed waived, and the invoice shall be deemed due and payable for the amount of such invoice. Unless the Agreement specifically states otherwise, the prices in this Agreement do not include sales tax, and to the extent sales tax is applicable to any services, materials and/or equipment, such sales tax will be listed separately on the Service Contractor's invoices, and the Customer agrees to pay for all applicable sales taxes. The prices in this Agreement do not include any costs associated with using any invoicing software, portals or services required by the Customer or of any requirement by the Customer for the Service Contractor to procure additional insurance or higher limits of insurance than are typically carried by the Service Contractor, and to the extent there are any costs incurred by the Service Contractor to comply with such requirements, the Customer agrees to reimburse the Service Contractor for such costs. The Customer further agrees to pay finance charges of 1½ % per month for invoices not paid within 30 days of the invoice date. In the event that the Customer fails to pay the Service Contractor in accordance with the agreed payment terms: (1) the Service Contractor may, at its sole discretion, stop all work under this Agreement and any other Agreement between the Service Contractor and the Customer until such time as the Customer's account is brought current; and (2) the Customer agrees to reimburse the Service Contractor for any and all costs of collection of the outstanding balance, including but not limited to the Service Contractor's attorneys' fees, expert fees, court costs and any other legal expenses that the Service Contractor incurs, even if the costs of collection exceed the outstanding balance. The Service Contractor and the Customer agree that in the event a dispute arises with respect to this Agreement, such dispute shall be resolved in a court of competent jurisdiction in the county in which Service Contractor's home office is located and this Agreement shall be governed and interpreted by the laws of the state in which Service Contractor's home office is located, exclusive of its conflict of laws principles. THE SERVICE CONTRACTOR AND THE CUSTOMER EXPRESSLY CONSENT TO THE PERSONAL JURISDICTION OF THE AFORMENTIONED STATE, AGREE TO THE AFOREMENTIONED COUNTY AS THE APPROPRIATE VENUE FOR DISPUTES, AND IRREVOCABLY WAIVE TRIAL BY JURY IN ANY ACTION, PROCEEDING, OR COUNTERCLAIM, WHETHER AT LAW OR IN EQUITY, BROUGHT BY EITHER PARTY IN CONNECTION WITH THIS AGREEMENT.

Where the Service Contractor renders service for the Customer other than those services specified in the Program, the Customer agrees to pay for such services at the Service Contractor's current service rates in addition to vehicle and other related service charges. Loss of time or productivity due to unexpected events that may restrict or limit access to the Covered Equipment, associated equipment of components shall be invoiced at the current service rates in addition to vehicle and other related service charges. The fees and surcharges set forth in this Agreement are estimates based on the market conditions at the time that this Agreement was entered. Service Contractor will use reasonable efforts to maintain the fees and surcharges as estimated in this Agreement. However, due to severe fluctuations in material, equipment and fuel costs, Service Contractor reserves its right to modify the fees and surcharges during the term of the Agreement with regard to any services rendered for the Customer, other than those services specified in the Program.

The term of this Agreement (the "Term") is designated on the signature page of the Agreement. The Customer and the Service Contractor agree that the Term or any renewal term thereafter shall automatically renew for a one- year period ("Renewal Term") under the same terms and conditions of the Agreement, and subject to adjustment at the commencement of each Renewal Term to reflect increases in labor, material and other costs, unless the Agreement is terminated in writing by either the Customer or the Service Contractor no less than thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of the current Term or Renewal Term. If any of the rates to be charged by the Service Contractor and/or vehicle and other related service charges for the upcoming Renewal Term will change, the Service Contractor will notify the Customer of such changes in writing.

The Service Contractor's liability hereunder shall not exceed the annual cost of this Agreement, except in the event where damage to the Covered Equipment has been caused by the Service Contractor while performing routine maintenance or service, and then only to the extent of the replacement parts and installation thereof. In no event shall the Service Contractor be liable for consequential damages or losses, including but not limited to loss of profits, loss of use of the Covered Equipment, loss of the use of any associated





or supported equipment, high or unusual utility cost, investment cost of substitute facilities, or rental of equipment. During the Term of the Agreement, the Service Contractor agrees to either repair or replace any defective work performed by the Service Contractor. The determination as to whether such work is to be repaired or replaced is within the sole discretion of the Service Contractor. Unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the Service Contractor and the Customer, upon the termination of this Agreement or the expiration of the Term, whichever occurs first, the Service Contractor shall have no further obligations to repair or replace work performed during the Term, and Customer shall be responsible for maintaining the Covered Equipment upon the termination of this Agreement or the expiration of the Term, whichever occurs first. Any warranty of the materials, parts and equipment installed by Service Contractor

shall be subject to the manufacturers' standard warranty terms, if any, and Customer's exclusive remedy with respect to any claims of defects in such materials, parts or equipment shall be governed by the manufacturers' standard warranty. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Customer shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Service Contractor, its agent and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses and expenses (including but not limited to attorneys' fees) arising out of or resulting from the performance of work hereunder, provided that such claim, damage, loss or expense is caused in whole or in part by an active or passive act or omission of the Customer, anyone directly or indirectly employed by the Customer, or anyone for whose acts the Customer may be liable, regardless of whether it is caused in part by the negligence of the Service Contractor. Further and notwithstanding the preceding sentence, the Service Contractor shall be held harmless by the Customer and shall not be liable to the Customer for any claims, liabilities, damages, losses and expenses related to mold or the creation of mold at the Customer's location(s) and shall have no obligation to treat, identify or remove such mold.

The Customer agrees to not solicit or hire employees of Service Contractor and/or the Service Contractor's subcontractors for itself and/or for any corporation, which Customer now represents or with which Customer now or may later be affiliated during the term of this Agreement and for a period of one year after the termination of the Agreement.

PANDEMIC AND EPIDEMIC PRECAUTIONS

The Customer and the Service Contractor acknowledge that pandemics and/or epidemics may severely impact the location where the services will be performed. As a result, in the event of a pandemic and/or epidemic, Federal, State and Local guidelines and requirements may be imposed and modified, which may impact the timing and cost of the services under the Agreement.

The Customer and the Service Contractor agree that: (1) the Customer and the Service Contractor will both use commercially reasonable efforts with respect to the services under the Agreement; (2) the Customer and the Service Contractor and their respective employees, agents and representatives will comply with applicable Federal, State and Local government quarantines, shelter-in-place orders, regulations, executive orders and/or directives, including but not limited to any recommendations or requirements of the Centers for Disease Control, U.S. Department of Labor, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, and/or any comparable State or Local agencies (collectively, "Pandemic/Epidemic Requirements"); (3) the Customer and the Service Contractor will both use commercially reasonable efforts to keep each other informed of pertinent updates or developments regarding their obligations to comply with Pandemic/Epidemic Requirements; and (4) if the Service Contractor's performance of the services under the Agreement is delayed, suspended and/or effected by Pandemic/Epidemic Requirements and/or by their direct or indirect impacts, the Service Contractor shall be entitled to adjustments to the schedule and/or the prices under the Agreement, provided the Service Contractor notifies the Customer within a reasonable period of time after the Service Contractor learns of the delay, suspension and/or effect.

WHEREAS, the City desires to construct, for the benefit of the public in general, a public walkway from the City Property over a portion of the Property to the Antietam Creek (the "Public Walkway"). The portion of the Property which the City desires to occupy exclusively to construct the Public Walkway is depicted on drawing entitled "Public Walkway Easement for the City of Hagerstown Concept 05-07-2025," attached hereto as Exhibit A on the attached Property Acquisition Agreement;

WHEREAS, to facilitate the public's access to the Antietam Creek, the City desires to acquire a perpetual easement over, across, and through portions of the Property (the "Easement"), for the purpose of constructing and maintaining the Public Walkway. The particular portion of the Property to be conveyed as an easement area to the City is shown and described on Exhibit A as Proposed 0.79 AC Access/Maintenance Easement over Lands of Sergey Pivovar to Serve the City of Hagerstown;

WHERAS, the City's acquisition of the Easement shall not relieve the Seller of its obligation to maintain, repair and/or replace the weir which is located on the Property. The City shall have no obligation with respect to the weir, and the Seller shall indemnify and hold harmless the City with respect to any liability stemming from the weir. This provision shall survive closing; and

WHEREAS, in exchange for the Seller's conveyance of the Easement, the City shall pay the Seller the sum of TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS and 00/100 CENTS (\$20,000.00) (the "Payment"). The City's payment to the Seller shall occur at Closing;

WHEREAS, the City has applied for Program Open Space Funds through the State of Maryland to fund the Payment and other costs related to the acquisition of the easement over the Property. Even should the POS funds not be awarded, the City shall still move forward with the purchase of the Easement over the Property;

WHEREAS, attached hereto and incorporated herein is a Property Acquisition Agreement, including Exhibits A and B, for the purchase of an easement over, across, under and through portions of the Pivovar Property; and

WHEREAS the Mayor and Council believe it to be in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Hagerstown to enter into said Property Acquisition Agreement.

NOW THERFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Hagerstown, Maryland, as its duly constituted legislative body, as follows:

- 1. That the aforegoing Recitals be and are hereby incorporated herein as if set forth verbatim.
- That the City's acquisition of the Easement pursuant to the terms of the attached Property 2. Acquisition Agreement is hereby approved.
- 3. That the Mayor be and is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Property Acquisition Agreement with the Sergey Pivovar Revocable Living Trust Date the 18th Day of May, 2022 a copy of which (including Exhibits A and B) is attached hereto and incorporated hereby reference.
- That City Staff be and are hereby authorized to execute and deliver any additional 4. documentation and take any additional steps necessary to effectuate the purpose of this ordinance and satisfy the terms of the aforesaid Property Acquisition Agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, ENACTED AND ORDAINED THAT this ordinance shall become effective at the expiration of thirty (30) calendar days following its approval.

PROPERTY ACQUISITION AGREEMENT

THIS PROPERTY	ACQUISITION AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is entered into this
day of	2025 (the "Effective Date"), by and between the SERGEY
PIVOVAR REVOCABLE	LIVING TRUST DATED THE 18th DAY OF MAY, 2022, a Maryland
Trust (hereinafter some	times referred to as "Seller"); and the MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF HAGERST	OWN, MARYLAND, a municipal corporation of the State of
Maryland, (hereinafter s	sometimes referred to as "Buyer" or "City").

RECITALS

- A. Seller is the owner of that certain parcel of unimproved real property consisting of 2.9633 acres and located at Mt. Aetna Road, Hagerstown, Washington County, Maryland 21740 (TM 311, Parcel 973; Tax Acct. No. 17-025759, Liber 7170, folio 202) (the " **Property**");
- B. The City is the owner of that certain parcel of unimproved real property consisting of 0.5 acres and located on Mt. Aetna Road, Hagerstown, Washington County, Maryland (TM 311, Parcel 956; Tax Acct. No. 17-022334, Liber 220, folio 462) (the "City Property");
- C. The City desires to construct, for the benefit of the public in general, a walkway from the City Property over a portion of the Property to the Antietam Creek (the "Public Walkway"). The portion of the Property which the City desires to occupy exclusively to construct the Public Walkway is depicted on drawing entitled "Public Walkway Easement for the City of Hagerstown Concept 05-07-2025," attached hereto as Exhibit A;
- D. To facilitate the public's access to the **Antietam Creek**, the City desires to acquire a perpetual easement over, across, and through portions of the Property (the "**Easement**"), for the purpose of constructing and maintaining the Public Walkway. The particular portion of the Property to be conveyed as an easement area to the City is shown and described on Exhibit A as *Proposed 0.79 AC Access/Maintenance Easement over Lands of Sergey Pivovar to Serve the City of Hagerstown*;
- E. The City's acquisition of the Easement shall not relieve the Seller of its obligation to maintain, repair and/or replace the weir which is located on the Property. The City shall have no obligation with respect to the weir, and the Seller shall indemnify and hold harmless the City with respect to any liability stemming from the weir. This provision shall survive closing; and
- F. In exchange for the Seller's conveyance of the Easement, the City shall pay the Seller the sum of TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS and 00/100 CENTS (\$20,000.00) (the "Payment"). The City acknowledges that it is responsible for any and all applicable permit

fees required in connection with the construction of the Public Walkway. The City's payment to the Seller shall occur at Closing.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, which are made a part hereof, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto hereby agree as follows:

- Incorporation of Recitals and Defined Terms. The parties agree that the foregoing Recitals are true, complete, and hereby incorporated by reference.
- 2. **Consideration**. The City agrees to acquire and Seller agrees to convey the Easement over, across, under and through the Property for the Payment,
- 3. Closing. Closing on the transfer of the Easement from Seller to the City (the "Closing") shall occur within FIFTEEN (15) days immediately following satisfaction of the Closing Conditions (defined below). No later than FIVE (5) days prior to Closing, the City shall provide to Seller a Deed of Easement and Maintenance Agreement as to the Public Walkway, the form of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B. At Closing, Seller shall deliver inter alia the final Deed of Easement. Each party shall be responsible for its own attorney's fees. It is the parties mutual understanding that, as an instrument of writing transferring property to a political subdivision of the State of Maryland, the Deed of Easement shall be exempt from recordation tax (MD Code, Tax-Property, \$13-207(a)(1)); and agricultural transfer tax (MD Code, Tax-Property, \$13-305(h)).
- 4. Title. Buyer shall have the right to inspect the status of title to the Property. Promptly after execution hereof, Buyer may obtain at Buyer's expense a title report or title commitment ("Commitment") and, at Buyer's election, a UCC lien search for the Property. Buyer may also obtain, at Buyer's sole cost and expense, a current ALTA/ASCM survey of the Property. In the event the Commitment discloses or Buyer becomes aware of any lien on the Property created by Seller that can be discharged or satisfied by the payment of money ("Monetary Title Matters"), Seller shall discharge or satisfy such Monetary Title Matters on or prior to the Closing Date. If Seller fails to discharge or satisfy any such Monetary Title Matters as aforesaid, Buyer, at its sole option, and in addition to any other rights and remedies it may have under this Agreement, at law and/or in equity, shall have the right to discharge and satisfy the same. Title to the Property shall be subject only to the following matters: (i) the lien of real estate taxes and sewer and water rents not yet due and payable; and (ii) such matters appearing on the Commitment to which Buyer shall fail to object (collectively, the "Permitted

Exceptions"). Title to the Property shall be insurable, together with such title insurance endorsements as Buyer may reasonably request, at regular rates (including applicable rates for such endorsements) from a title insurance company licensed in the State of Maryland and selected by Buyer. In the event Buyer's review of title to the Property reveals any matters that are unacceptable to Buyer in its sole and absolute discretion (other than Monetary Title Matters which Seller is required to remedy as aforesaid), Buyer shall notify Seller thereof within thirty (30) days after the Effective Date (the "Objection Notice"). Within ten (10) days after receipt of the Objection Notice, Seller shall notify Buyer in writing, whether Seller shall undertake to cure such unacceptable exception(s). In the event Seller elects not to cure any unacceptable exception or is unable with the exercise of due diligence to satisfy said objection before the Closing Date, Buyer may, at its option, either (a) accept title subject to the objections raised by Buyer, without an adjustment of the Purchase Price, in which event each of said objections shall be deemed waived for all purposes and considered a Permitted Exception, or (b) terminate this Agreement. If Buyer shall terminate this Agreement, then (i) this Agreement shall be deemed to have terminated as of the date of Buyer's notice without need for any further action by either party, and (ii) neither Buyer nor Seller shall have any further obligations to one another hereunder, except for those which expressly survive termination of this Agreement.

- 5. Representations and Warranties of Seller. Seller hereby makes the following representations to Buyer, all of which are made as of the Effective Date and shall be true and correct in all material respects on and as of the Closing Date.
- 5.1 Enforceability: Authorization. This Agreement and the documents, affidavits, certificates and other instruments to be executed and delivered by Seller pursuant hereto are, or will be when executed and delivered by Seller, the legal, valid and binding obligations of Seller and enforceable against Seller in accordance with its terms. Seller has obtained all consents necessary for, and possesses full authority and legal right to authorize Seller's entry into and performance of this Agreement, the documents, affidavits, certificates and other instruments to be executed and delivered by Seller pursuant hereto and/or the transactions contemplated hereby or thereby. Other than this Agreement, there are no other oral or written agreements relating to the use, occupancy or possession of the Property that would prohibit, interfere or in any way restrict Buyer's use thereof.
- 5.2 Ownership of the Property. Seller is the fee simple record and beneficial owner of the Property. No person or entity has an option, right of first refusal or other similar right to acquire all or any portion of the Property. Seller has performed all obligations under and is not in default in complying with the terms and provisions of any covenants, conditions, restrictions, rights-of-way or easements applicable to the Property.

- 5.3 <u>No Conflicts</u>. Neither the execution of this Agreement nor the consummation of the transactions contemplated hereby will conflict with, or result in a breach of, the terms, conditions or provisions of, or constitute a default under, any agreement or instrument to which Seller is a party.
- 5.4 Third Party Consents. All consents required from any governmental authority or third party in connection with the execution and delivery of this Agreement by Seller or the consummation by Seller of the transactions contemplated hereby have been made or obtained or shall have been made or obtained by the Closing Date. Seller expressly understands that the consent of the Maryland Department of Natural Resources ("DNR") shall be required in order for Buyer to enter into to this Agreement. Buyer shall diligently pursue said consent and shall immediately inform Seller of the decision of the DNR.
- 5.5 Condemnation, Violation of Laws, Etc. Seller has not received notice of, and, to Seller's knowledge, there are no existing violations of any federal, state, county or municipal laws, ordinances, orders, codes, regulations or requirements affecting all or any portion of the Property, including, without limitation, violations of housing, building, safety, health, environmental, fire or zoning ordinances, codes and regulations of the respective jurisdictions within which the Property is located or any certificate(s) of occupancy issued for the Property.
- 5.6 <u>Flood Hazard Area</u>. To the best of Seller's actual knowledge with no duty to investigate further, a portion of the Property is located in an area designated by any governmental entity as a flood hazard area.

5.7 Hazardous Conditions.

- (i) During Seller's ownership there have been no, and there are no pending or, to the best of Seller's actual knowledge, threatened: (A) claims, complaints, notices, or requests for information received by Seller with respect to any alleged violation of any Environmental Law with respect to the Property, or (B) claims, complaints, notices, or requests for information to Seller regarding potential or alleged liability under any Environmental Law with respect to the Property.
- (ii) To the best of Seller's actual knowledge with no duty to investigate, no conditions exist at, on, or under the Property that, with the passage of time or the giving of notice or both, would constitute a Hazardous Condition or give rise to liability under any Environmental Law.
- (iii) Seller has not received notice of any violation of any orders, directives, requirements, permits, certificates, approvals, licenses, and other authorizations relating to Environmental Laws with respect to the Property.

(iv) To the best of Seller's actual knowledge with no duty to investigate there are no aboveground tanks in excess of 275 gallon storage capacity or any underground storage tanks (collectively, "USTs") located on or in the Property. Seller has not removed or abandoned any USTs on or in the Property and Seller has no knowledge of the existence, abandonment or removal of USTs from the Property.

For purposes of this Agreement, the following terms shall have the meaning as indicated:

"Environmental Law" shall mean: (i)the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (42 U.S.C. §§9601 et seq.) as amended; (ii) the Solid Waste Disposal Act, as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (42 U.S.C. §§ 6901 et seq.), as amended; (iii) the Emergency Planning and Community Right to Know Act (42 U.S.C. §§ 11001 et se&), as amended; (iv) the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. §§ 7401 et seq.\ as amended; (v) the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. §§ 1251 et seq. as amended; (vi) the Toxic Substances Control Act (15 U.S.C. §§2601 et seq. as amended; (vii)the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act (49 U.S.C. §§1801 et seq/h as amended; (viii)the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (7 U.S.C. §§ 136 et seq.), as amended; (ix) the Safe Drinking Water Act (42 U.S.C. §§ 300f et seq.), as amended; (x) any state, county, municipal or local statutes, laws or ordinances similar or analogous to the statutes listed in parts (i) -(ix) of this definition; (xi) any amendments to the statutes, laws or ordinances listed in parts (i) -(x) of this definition, regardless of whether the same are in existence on the date hereof; (xii) any rules, regulations, guidelines, directives, orders or the like adopted pursuant to or to implement the statutes, laws, ordinances and amendments listed in parts (i) - (xi) of this definition; and (xiii) any other law, statute, ordinance, amendment, rule, regulation, guideline, directive, order or the like relating to environmental or other matters covered by the foregoing.

"Governmental Authorities" shall mean any board, bureau, commission, department or body of any municipal, township, county, city, state or federal governmental unit, or any subdivision thereof, having or acquiring jurisdiction over any of the Property or the ownership, management, operation, use or improvement thereof.

"Hazardous Conditions" shall mean the presence on, in or about the Property (including ground water) of Hazardous Materials, the concentration, condition, quantity, location or other characteristic of which fails to comply with applicable Environmental Laws. "Hazardous Material" shall mean any chemical, substance, waste, material, equipment or fixture defined as or deemed hazardous, toxic, a pollutant, a contaminant, or otherwise regulated under any Environmental Law, including but H Litigation. No proceeding, suit or litigation relating to the Seller or the Property or any part thereof is pending or, to the best of Seller's actual knowledge, threatened in any court or other tribunal or before any Governmental Authority. Seller is not the subject of, nor has Seller received any written notice of or threat that it has or will become the subject of, any actions or proceedings under the United States Bankruptcy Code, 11 U.S.C. §§ 101, et seq.

("Bankruptcy Code"), or under any other federal, state or local laws affecting the rights of debtors and/or creditors generally, whether voluntary or involuntary and including, without limitation, proceedings to set aside or avoid any transfer of any interest in property or obligations, whether denominated as a fraudulent conveyance, preferential transfer or otherwise, or to recover the value thereof or to charge, encumber or impose a lien thereon.

- 5.8 <u>FIRPTA</u>. Seller is not a "foreign person" within the meaning of Section 1445 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "**Code**"), and the sale of the Property is not subject to the federal income tax withholding requirements of such section of the Code.
- 5.9 <u>Mechanic's Liens</u>. There are no claims for labor performed, materials furnished or services rendered in connection with the development, construction, improvement, renovation or repair of the Property with respect to which liens may or could be filed against the Property, either pending or threatened.
- 5.10 Tax Matters. No federal or other taxing authority (each, a "Taxing Authority" and collectively, the "Taxing Authorities") has asserted in writing any tax deficiency, lien, interest or penalty against Seller or the Property that has not been paid, and there is no pending audit or inquiry from any Taxing Authority relating to Seller or the Property, and to Seller's knowledge, no event has occurred and no condition or circumstance exists which presents a material risk that any tax deficiency, lien, interest, penalty or other assessment will be imposed against Seller or the Property.
- 5.11 Re-Zoning. Seller is not a party to, nor does Seller have any actual knowledge of, any threatened proceeding for the rezoning of the Property or any portion thereof, or the taking of any other action by governmental authorities that would have an adverse or material impact on the value of the Property or use thereof.
- 5.12 <u>Condemnation</u>. Seller has not received any written notice advising it of any pending or threatened condemnation or other governmental taking proceedings affecting all or any part of the Property.
- 5.12 Except as otherwise provided herein, Seller is making no warranties as to the condition of the Property is being conveyed "AS IS, WHERE IS AND WITH ALL FAULTS."

6. Closing Conditions.

A. Easement. The City and Seller shall have entered into a written Deed of Easement Agreement and Maintenance Agreement for the easement depicted on Exhibit A. The form of the Easement Agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

- 7. <u>Successors and Assigns</u>. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors, assigns and transferees. This Agreement shall also be deemed to run with the land.
- 8. Notice. Notices and other communications required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be deemed to have been duly given if in writing and delivered by recognized overnight delivery service or email transmission, as follows:

- 9. Governing Law. Regardless of its place of execution, this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Maryland as to interpretation, construction, and performance, without regard to its conflicts of law provisions.
- **10.** Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties, there being no other terms, oral or written, except as herein expressed.
- 11. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement (i) may be executed in two (2) or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all such counterparts shall together constitute one and the same instrument; (ii) may be executed by copies of physically signed documents exchanged via email attachment in PDF format or equivalent.

- **12.** Exhibits Incorporated. Each Exhibit attached to and referred to in this Agreement is hereby incorporated by reference as though set forth in full where referred to herein.
- 13. Amendments. This Agreement may be amended, changed or modified only by written amendment executed by the parties hereto. No waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be valid unless in writing signed by the party charged.
- 14. Further Agreements. The parties shall at any time and from time to time after Closing, upon request of the other, do, execute, acknowledge and deliver, or will cause to be done, executed, acknowledged or delivered, all such further acts, deeds, conveyances and assurances as may reasonably be required for the better conveying, transferring, assuring and confirming the terms and conditions contemplated herein.
 - 15. <u>Time of the Essence</u>. Time shall be of the essence of this Agreement.
- 16. Survival. The obligations, agreements and covenants contained herein or liabilities accrued under this Agreement which, by their terms, require their performance after the expiration or termination of this Agreement shall be enforceable after the Closing or other de jure termination of this Agreement, the parties specifically acknowledging that the Closing and the execution and recordation of deed and deed of easement contemplated herein shall not terminate the obligations of the parties that are intended and by their terms survive the Closing.
- 17. Severability. If any provision of this Agreement shall be determined to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby, and every provision of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- **18.** <u>Waiver</u>. Neither party's waiver of the other's breach of any term, covenant or condition contained in this Agreement shall be deemed to be a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or any other term, covenant, or condition in this Agreement.
- 19. Assignment. This Agreement may not be assigned by either party without the express written consent of each party.
- **20.** Headings. Headings are intended only as a matter of convenience and for reference and in no way define, limit, or describe the scope or intent of this Agreement.

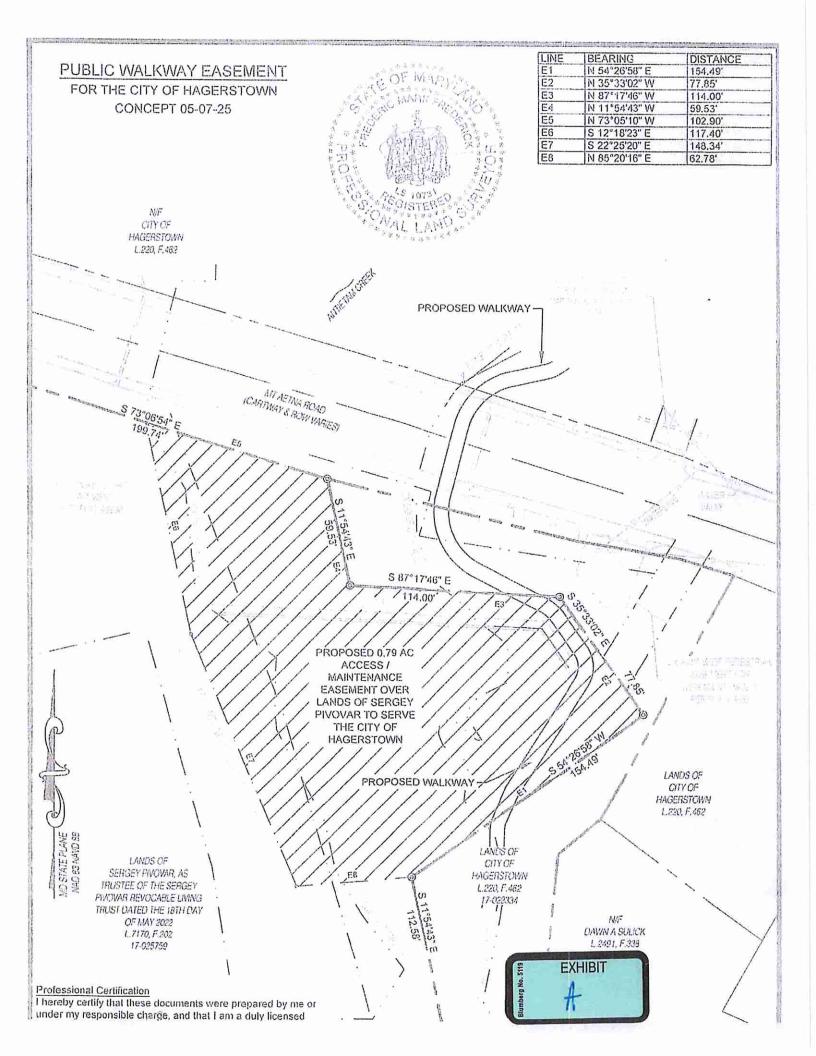

DEED OF EASEMENT AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT

THIS DEED OF EASEMENT AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT is made this _____ day of ______, 2025, by and between the SERGEY PIVOVAR REVOCABLE LIVING TRUST DATED THE 18TH DAY OF MAY, 2022, a Maryland trust in the State of Maryland (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Grantor") and the MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAGERSTOWN, MARYLAND, a municipal corporation of the State of Maryland, (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Grantee").

WITNESSETH: That for TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS AND 00/100 CENTS (\$20,000.00) monetary consideration and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the said Grantor does hereby grant and convey unto the Grantee, its successors and assigns, a Perpetual and Permanent Easement and the right of ingress and egress for the purpose of constructing, maintaining, repairing, replacing and removing, as needed, a raised wooden walkway for public access to the Antietam Creek and the necessary accessories, fixtures and appurtenances thereto (collectively "the Facilities"), across and over a portion of the unimproved property, situate in Election District No. 17 of Washington County, Maryland, near the southern side of Mt Aetna Road, and more particularly described as follows: "Proposed 0.79 AC Access/Maintenance Easement over Lands of Sergey Pivovar to Serve the City of Hagerstown."

Being a portion of all that piece or parcel of land that was conveyed by REO 2015, LLC unto the Grantor by deed dated November 30, 2022, and recorded among the Land Records of Washington County, Maryland, in Liber 7170, folio 202.

The above-described easement is graphically depicted as "Proposed 0.79 AC Access/Maintenance Easement over Lands of Sergey Pivovar to Serve the City of Hagerstown," on the drawing entitled "Public Walkway Easement for the City of Hagerstown Concept 05-07-2025," consisting of one (1) page, a copy of which is appended hereto and made a part hereof.

SUBJECT to all other easements, rights of way, covenants, conditions and restrictions of record applicable thereto.

AND SUBJECT to the rights and obligations contained herein.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the right and privilege of the easement hereby granted to the use and benefit of the within Grantee, its successors and assigns.



AND IT IS FURTHER understood and agreed by the parties that the easement herein granted is granted under and subject to the following terms and conditions:

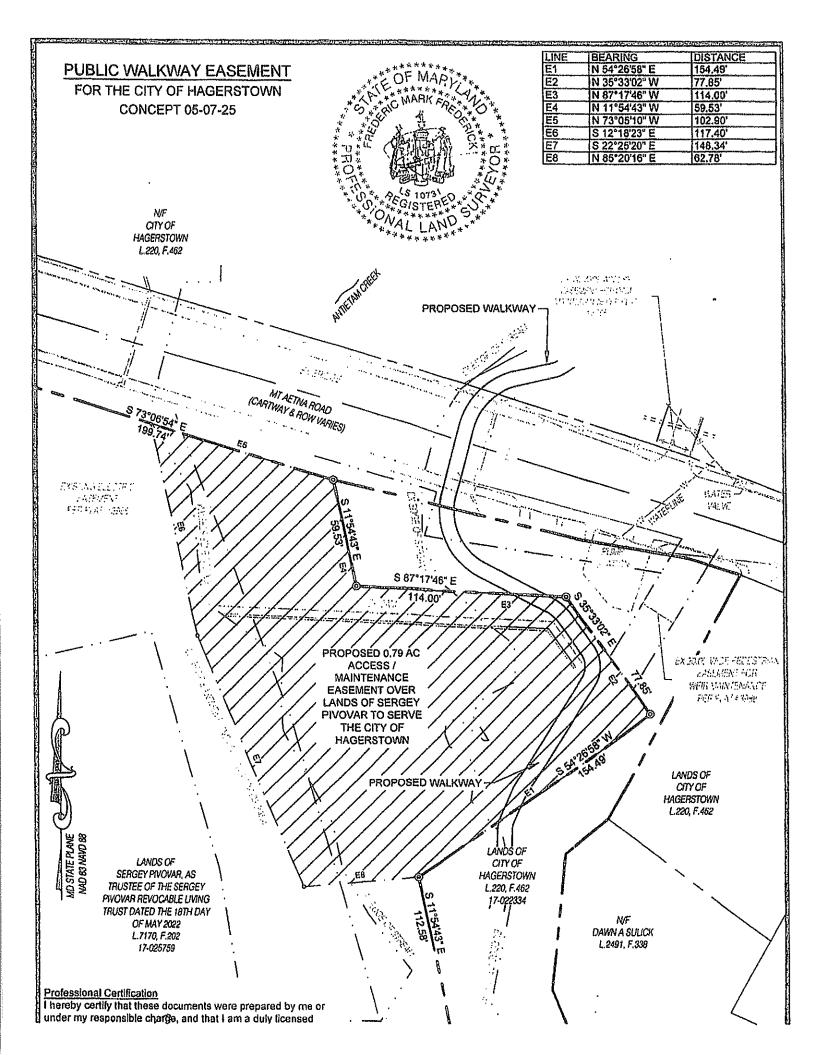
- Grantee shall perform, at its cost and effort, such maintenance, repairs, and replacements as are necessary to keep the Facilities clear and functioning so as not to cause damage to Grantor's property. Grantee shall repair, at its cost and effort, any changes made to the easement area or Grantor's property as a result of any maintenance and repairs.
- Except as otherwise provided in this Deed of Easement and Maintenance Agreement, neither party shall, without the written permission of the other directly or through others, erect any gate, fence, building or other structure within the easement area; make a fill or excavation of the earth so as to cause a change in contour; intentionally inundate the land with water, or otherwise alter the easement area. In the event a party removes any obstruction or otherwise corrects any condition constituting a violation of this paragraph, the violating party shall promptly reimburse other party's reasonable costs of doing so.
- 3. Grantee shall indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the Grantor from any and all claims, rights, judgments, etc. resulting from injuries, including death, damages and losses sustained by any person or property arising from the Grantee's negligence in the use of the easement area conveyed herein or the construction, maintenance or repair of the Facilities.
- 4. Grantor shall continue to maintain, repair and/or replace the dam/weir which is located on Grantor's property. Grantee shall have no obligation with respect to the dam/weir, and the Grantor shall indemnify and hold harmless the Grantee with respect to any liability stemming from the dam/weir.
- 5. This Deed of Easement and Maintenance Agreement shall be for the exclusive use of the Grantee, its guests and invitees, shall run with the land and be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assigns, and the terms "Grantor" and "Grantee" hereunder shall include their respective successor and assigns.
- 6. This Deed of Easement is conveyed together with the right to excavate for the construction, repair, and/or replacement of the Facilities; together with the further right to remove trees, bushes, undergrowth, or other obstructions interfering with the operation, maintenance, and/or replacement thereof.
- 7. Both parties acknowledge that this Deed of Easement is subject to Natural Resources Article \$\$5-906 (f)(1)(i) and 5-906(f)(1)(ii) which state: Land acquired or developed under a State grant from Program Open Space may not be converted, without written approval of the Secretary, the Secretary of the Department of Budget Management, and the Secretary of the Department of Planning from outdoor public recreation or open space use to any other use. Any conversion in land use may be approved only after the local governing body

replaces the land with land of at least equivalent area and of equal recreation open space value. In addition, Natural Resources Article \$5-906 (f)(2)(i) states: For any conversion of land acquired or developed under a State grant from Program Open Space as provided in paragraph (1) of this subsection, the appraised monetary value of the land proposed for acquisition shall be equal to or greater than the appraised monetary value of the land to be converted, under the proposed new use of the of the converted land. For purposes of this paragraph, "land" shall mean and refer to the Grantee's easement interest.

§ 79-1. Definitions.

For the purpose of this chapter, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meanings given herein.

CITY — The City of Hagerstown, Maryland, with administrative offices at 1 East Franklin Street, City Hall, Hagerstown, Maryland 21740.

EMERGENCY — An unforeseen circumstance or combination of circumstances that requires immediate action. This term includes but is not limited to a fire, natural disaster, automobile accident or any situation requiring immediate action to prevent serious bodily injury, loss of life or extensive property damage.

JUVENILE — For the purposes of this chapter, a juvenile is any unmarried, unemancipated person under 17 years of age.[Amended 10-28-2014 by Ord. No. O-14-21]

PARENT — Any person having physical or legal custody of a juvenile as a biological, step- or adoptive parent, a legal guardian, a person over the age of 18 who stands in loco parentis or a person to whom physical custody has been awarded by court order.

PUBLIC PLACE — Any place to which the public or a substantial group of the public has access and includes, but is not limited to, streets, sidewalks, alleys, common areas of schools, shopping centers, parking lots, parks, playgrounds, transportation facilities, theaters, restaurants, convenience stores, shops, bowling alleys, taverns, cafes, arcades and similar areas that are open to the use of the public.

§ 79-2. Curfew for juveniles.

It shall be unlawful, unless otherwise provided herein, for any juvenile to be or remain in or upon a public place within the City of Hagerstown during the following periods:

Every day of the week from 11:00 p.m. on that day until 5:00 a.m. on the following day.

- A. 10:00 p.m. on any Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday until 5:00 a.m. of the following day; and
- B. 11:00 p.m. on any Friday or Saturday until 5:00 a.m. the following day.

§ 79-3. Exceptions and defenses.

The following shall constitute valid exceptions and defenses to the operation of this chapter:

^{1.} Editor's Note: This ordinance also repealed former Ch. 79, Curfew for Juveniles, adopted 9-26-1995 by Ord. No. 1995-31.

- A. When a juvenile is accompanied by the juvenile's parent
- B. When a juvenile is attending or returning home by a direct route without any unnecessary detour or stop from a City event, a school activity or an activity of a religious or civic organization, or of a place of public entertainment, such as a movie, play or sporting event.
- C. When the juvenile is engaged in a legal employment activity or is returning from or going to his or her place of employment by a direct route.
- D. When a juvenile, with consent of his or her parentis engaged in interstate travel through the City, or beginning or ending in the City.
- E. When a juvenile is on the property where the juvenile resides, or on the sidewalk abutting the juvenile's residence.
- F. When a juvenile is exercising his or her First Amendment rights protected by the United States Constitution, including the rights of freedom of speech, assembly and the exercise of religion, after providing the Chief of Police with advance written notice of the time, place and manner of the exercise of such rights, signed by the juvenile and his or her parent.
- G. In case of an emergency.

§ 79-4. Parent responsibility.

It shall be unlawful for a parent to knowingly permit the juvenile to remain in any public place in violation of § 79-2 hereof. The term "knowingly" includes actual knowledge and knowledge that a parent should reasonably be expected to have concerning the whereabouts of a juvenile in that parent's care.

§ 79-5. Violations and penalties.

- A. Any juvenile who shall violate any of the provisions of this chapter may be charged with having committed a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500, and be prosecuted in accordance with Maryland Law. [Amended 9-15-2015 by Ord. No. O-15-24]
- B. Any individual who violates § 79-4 hereof shall be guilty of a municipal infraction and shall be subject to a fine in the following prepayable amount of \$500.00 [Amended 10-28-2014 by Ord. No. O-14-21]
 - (1) First offense: written warning.
 - (2) Second offense: fine of \$100.
 - (3) Third offense: fine of \$250.
 - (4) Fourth or subsequent offense: fine of \$500.

OPINION AND FINDINGS OF FACTS

The aforegoing matter was originally heard at Public Hearing by the Mayor and City Council on October 27, 2025, in accordance with the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance for the City of Hagerstown, Maryland.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The property, which is the subject of the proposed map amendment, is located at 1912 Day Road.

The proposal was filed by a contract purchaser of the property with consent of the property owner of the property.

The tract consists of 93 acres, more or less, contains one dwelling and is mostly used for agricultural production.

The Applicant intends to develop the tract as a unified development with a mixture of multiple housing types, with two commercial pads on Dual Highway, and to convey approximately 1 acre behind an adjacent office building to that property. These three areas will remain zoned CG. The center of the site is impacted by the 100-year floodplain as depicted on the City's 2017 Revised FEMA Floodplain Map.

The property is bisected by the zoning district boundary. The CG zoned area includes lands that are set back behind front-tier commercial spaces fronting Dual Highway, making the likely development of the eastern portion of the CG zoned lands difficult or unlikely for commercial uses that would most benefit from visibility from Dual Highway.

The area was initially zoned C2 (now relabeled CG) when the property was annexed in 1978, and the built environment along Dual Highway has evolved more over that time to focus commercial uses closer to Dual Highway. The district line was adjusted in a minor fashion in the 2010 Comprehensive Rezoning to make the division between districts more logical but did not take into account the possibility that a single developer would develop the tract for a unified development.

Dividing the property in the manner depicted, via a line drawn in a relatively arbitrary manner that leaves substantial portions of the tract in two zoning district without consideration of the shape, location or existing features of the property is clear evidence that the assigned CG zoning for a significant portion of the property of mistake in the current zoning of the area in question. Retention of the classifications as current depicted creates complications and difficulties in developing the tract in a unified manner.

CONCLUSION

Therefore, the Mayor and City Council find that those matters contained in the staff analysis and presented by the applicants at the Public Hearing on October 27, 2025, to be true and accurate, and that all procedural requirements prerequisite to approval of the reclassification of the lands subject to this application have been met. The Mayor and City Council find as a matter of fact the following:

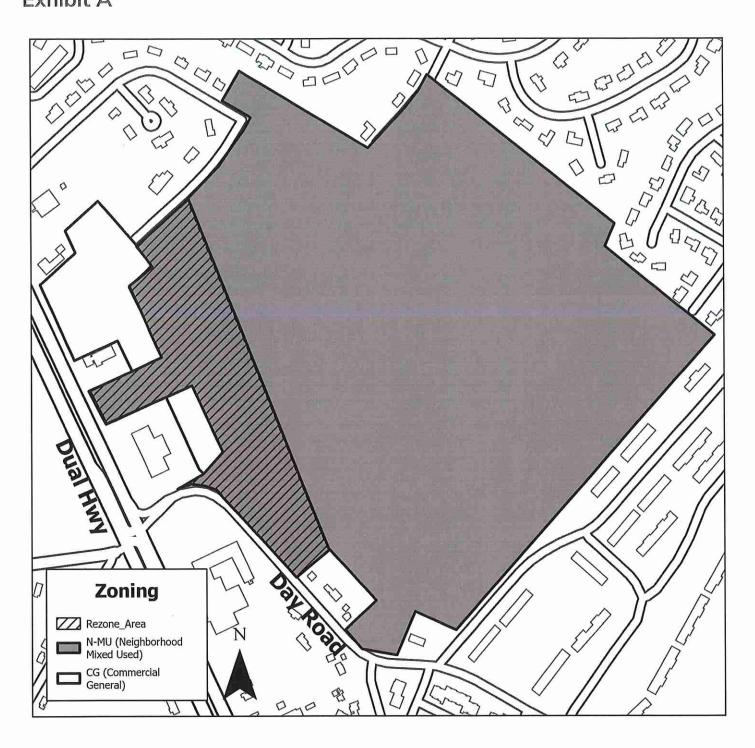
- 1. The Applicant has sufficiently demonstrated that the current classification of the area in question is a "mistake" pursuant to Maryland law; and
- 2. The appropriate classification of the area in question, as depicted on the illustration included in this exhibit, is N-MU (Neighborhood Mixed Use); and
- 3. The proposal generally does not violate the spirit and intent of the Zoning Ordinance; and
- 4. The proposal will not materially or adversely affect adjoining properties.

The Mayor and City Council further finds that in order to protect the real and/or perceived interests of both the current property owner and the Applicant/contract purchaser, that the reclassification shall be effective after the effective date of the Ordinance adopting this reclassification, and within the time period requested by the Applicant, becoming effective upon the conveyance of the property to the Applicant. Should the property not be conveyed to the applicant, this approval shall expire.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL ACTION REQUESTED

Staff is seeking approval from the Mayor and Council to apply for Program Open Space (POS) grant funding for Fiscal Year 2027 (FY27).

DISCUSSION

POS is a grant through the Maryland State Department of Natural Resources (DNR). DNR places the responsibility of grant review to the local county jurisdictions. The City's request will first go to Washington County Government for review and must be submitted by the end of the calendar year.

Each year, staff reviews and recommends any number of projects to be submitted for POS funding. The list of projects for FY27 and beyond is attached for your review.

The recommended FY27 projects in order of priority are as follows:

- 1. Replace Playground Equipment at Ridge Avenue Playground: Ridge Avenue Playground is located in the southwest quadrant of the City along Ridge Avenue running parallel to Burhans Boulevard. This small playground includes playground equipment of various configurations, basketball hoops, and a pavilion. The park serves a smaller community surrounded on 2 sides by active railroad tracks.
- 2. Construct a Shade Structure at the Fairgrounds Skatepark: It has been brought to our attention that the skaters and bicyclist are looking for more shade at the skatepark. The skatepark is a newer amenity to Fairgrounds Park and is still evolving. Skaters and bicyclists alike spend long hours at this park honing their skills or watching fellow skaters and bicyclists. There are few mature trees and only a couple of shade structures.

Attached are photos of the proposed projects and locations.

POS requires projects to have a useful life of at least 20 years. Proposed projects of a less useful lifespan are typically rejected by Washington County and DNR. For example, resurfacing a tennis or basketball court would not be funded but repaving the courts plus resurfacing could possibly be funded.

There is no guarantee that any or all the projects will be accepted. The proposed projects are submitted to Washington County Engineering Department. All requested projects throughout the County are brought before the Washington County Board of Parks & Recreation, who review all the projects. They can accept the projects as submitted, accept a portion of the projects, or reject all the projects.

DNR receives the Washington County approved list of projects. All the projects throughout the State are then taken to the Maryland State Public Works Board for final approval. Until written confirmation is received, the projects cannot move forward, or the funding could be jeopardized.

The applications are to include a 5-year plan. This plan varies from year-to-year as changes to priorities and funding occur.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Local funding typically requires at least a 10% match. If both projects are accepted, the City match would equate to \$30,000.

The City funding may or may not affect the FY27 budget. The projects are to be completed within a 5-year period of time. Therefore, City funds can sometimes be carried forward to future budgets if the projects are not completed within the proposed fiscal year. This can be due for a number of reasons including permitting, size of the project, or simply inadequate labor to complete a project in a timely manner.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommend submitting the project list as attached for POS grant funding consideration. Washington County staff will review the project to determine which projects may be funded. The final decision will be made by DNR later in calendar year 2026.

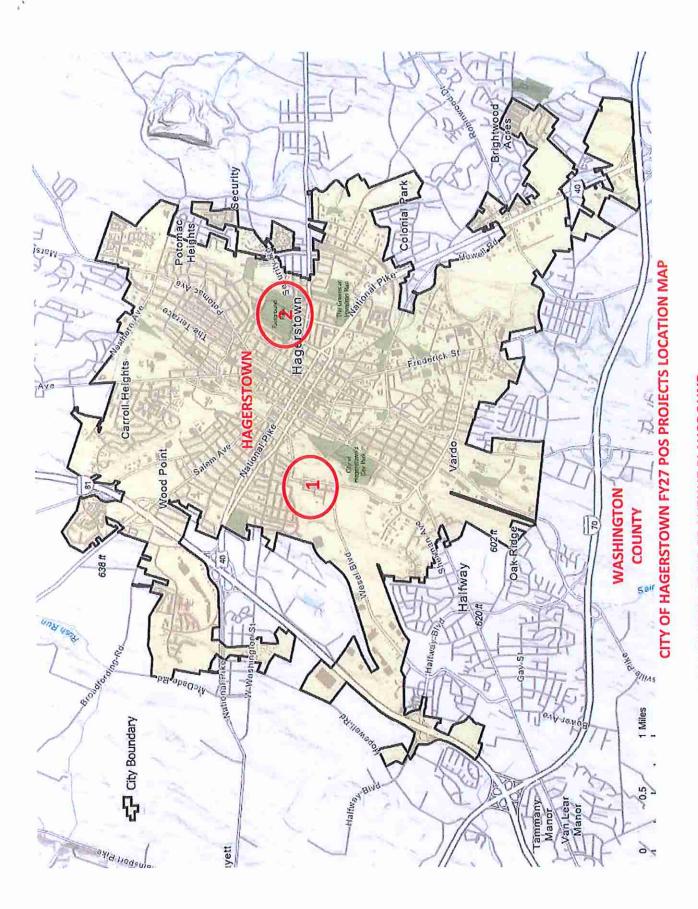

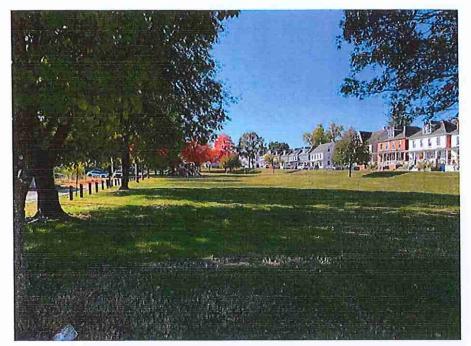

INVEST HAGERSTOWN – COMMERCIAL SIGN & FAÇADE GRANT PROGRAM

PROGRAM GOALS

In partnership with private developers, the City of Hagerstown wishes to:

- Inspire and enable significant redevelopment, both city-wide and in the urban core, reusing and repurposing existing vacant and under-utilized properties, in which there are significant market and/or physical condition barriers to development or redevelopment.
- 2. Create the opportunity for new jobs throughout the City of Hagerstown and Washington County.
- 3. Increase the value of Hagerstown's residential, commercial, and mixed-use properties.
- 4. Strengthen and improve market-rate rental properties and increase homeownership.

SUMMARY

The goal of the Commercial Sign & Facade Grant Program is to provide an incentive to businesses and property owners to enhance their building's presentation to the public with improved storefront designs and other façade elements to contribute to the overall enhancement of the City Center. The City also recognizes attractive signage is an important part of running a successful business, and if done right, may assist in building brand visibility and increasing customer awareness. This program is subject to funding availability and is on a first-come, first-served basis. All projects must pertain to residential, commercial or mixed-use buildings within the City's Downtown.

1. Commercial Sign grants range from a minimum of \$250, to maximum of \$1,500.

2. Façade grants range from a minimum of \$2,500, to maximum of \$7,500.

- 3. The grants both require a 1:1 match from the applicant. Example: a \$2,500 façade grant would require a \$2,500 investment from the applicant for a total project investment of \$5,000.
- 4. The applicant is the party responsible for the project expenses. The applicant will be required to demonstrate expenditures equal to the grant and the required match related to work that was completed.
- 5. A project may be defined as planned or in a pre-construction phase. Completed projects and those already in progress are ineligible. For projects that are planned, projects must start within 6 months of application. Work on facades must not begin and signs may not be ordered before City approval, and before HDC approval if required.
- 6. The City determines the required date of completion based on the project completion date shown on the application plus reasonable contingency.
- 7. Signs must be on-premise and applications must include sign dimensions, proposes design and layout, materials, and method of attachment.
- 8. Funding will be awarded upon completion of an approved project and development plan.
- 9. All projects shall comply with federal, State and local codes, laws and ordinances.
- 10. All grants are subject to funding availability.
- 11. Applications are accepted on a continual basis and the Invest Hagerstown Review Committee will review applications received monthly.
- 12. Building permits are typically required for the following (including but not limited to): installation of awnings and canopies, structural repairs, electrical repairs/installation, etc. Please contact the Planning and Code Administration Department for official permit requirements.
- 13. Any business planning to install signs at their location must check with the City of Hagerstown's Planning & Zoning Administration to determine allowable signage permissible, and to learn if a building permit is required for the proposed signs.

Eligible Applicants

- Eligible properties must be located within the designated Downtown City-Center Mixed-Use (CC-MU) Zoning Area and consist of residential, commercial, institutional, or mixed-use buildings/storefronts. All improvements must be visible from the street or other public right-of-way.
- 2. Eligible signage may include wall signs, window signage, sidewalk signs, floor signs, and more as local zoning allows. Please refer to City of Hagerstown Regulations for Business Signs prior to application.
- 3. Eligible project costs include construction improvement costs, materials, and soft costs including architectural and engineering fees.
- 4. Any business, property owner, organization or non-profit entity planning exterior improvements such as façade improvements, new signage, lighting, awnings, etc.

Ineligible Applications

- 1. Grants will not be provided for animation, bare-bulbs, or flashing illumination or imagery.
- 2. Grants will not be provided for certain types of businesses, including: pawn shops, gun shops, massage parlors, adult video/book shop, adult entertainment facilities, tanning salons, check- cashing facilities, gambling facilities, and liquor stores.
- 3. Projects that do not meet the minimum investment threshold.
- 4. Applicants who are not in good standing with the City, County, State or Federal Governments.

Additional Requirements for Commercial Sign and Façade Projects Located in Downtown Historic District

- 1. City Historic District Commission (HDC) approval is required.
- 2. HDC requirements include submitting 1 copy of drawing, sized 11x17 inches or smaller (if larger, provide 12 copies) and manufacturer's literature for all materials being proposed and/or sample materials proposed.
- 3. Applicant will be required to attend a Historic District Commission Meeting. These meetings are typically held on the second and fourth Thursday of each month in *City Hall, Room 407*.
- 4. Planning and Code Administration staff will work with you to schedule the meeting. For questions regarding the Historic District Commission Meetings, contact the Planning & Code Administration's Administrative Coordinator by phone at 301-739-8577 Ext. 138, or by email at planning@hagerstownmd.org.
- 5. Historic District Commission (HDC) information and HDC meeting schedule and deadlines for submission of materials is available at: https://www.hagerstownmd.org/101/Historic-District-Commission
- 6. Failure of the applicant to provide requested documents and failure of the applicant or representative to appear at the scheduled HDC meeting, will result in postponement of the application until the next regularly scheduled meeting. The applicant may be dismissed if there are two (2) or more postponements. If an application is denied, the same application shall not be renewed within a period of one (1) year of the denial.
- 7. After the project is completed, photos showing that completed work must be submitted.

City of Hagerstown - Regulations for Business Signs Downtown

8/8/2022

Any business or non-profit planning to install signs at their location must check with the City of Hagerstown to determine how much signage is permissible by Zoning and to learn if a building permit is required for the proposed signs. The following is a brief overview of the main sign regulations in the zoning ordinance for the downtown (CC-MU Zoning). For detailed information on what is permitted for each type of sign, it is recommended that you go to the Planning & Zoning page of the City web site and review the Signs section of the Zoning Article in the City's Land Management Code. If a property is located in a historic district, approval by the City's Historic District Commission is also required. For Zoning questions, email us at planning@hagerstownmd.org. For permit questions, email us at codecompliance@hagerstownmd.org.

<u>Prohibited Signs</u> – signs attached to vehicles and stationary equipment, temporary signs used over 90 days, and signs that completely cover glass entry doors are prohibited in any zoning district. In residential districts and the CC-MU and N-MU districts, animation, bare bulbs, or flashing illumination or imagery are prohibited.

Freestanding Signs – signs on a pole or monument base in the ground

- Size, Height and Number maximum of one per property, maximum of 10 feet tall, maximum 40 square feet in area. If identical sign faces, measure one side for area.
- Landscaping required around the base of any new freestanding sign structure.

Flush, Wall-mounted Signs – signs attached flat to the wall or painted directly on the wall

- **Size** one square foot per linear foot of building frontage on the street, if the building is 50 feet or less in width. 1.5 square feet per linear foot if he building is over 50 feet wide. If there is a historic sign panel area over the storefront, the tenant may fill that space with a sign no matter the area.
- Number of signs per building as many as desired provided the total square footage does not exceed what is allowed for the business or building.

<u>Projecting Signs</u> – signs hanging from a bracket perpendicular to the entrance wall.

- Hanging requirements must hang so sign is below 2nd floor for storefront tenants and below the roofline for upper floor tenants or single-user buildings. It must hang so there is 8 feet of clearance below the sign, extends no more than 52 inches from the wall, and does not come within 2 feet of the curb.
- Size 8 square foot maximum for a storefront tenant each storefront allowed such a sign. 36 square foot maximum for in a vertically oriented format for upper floor tenants or a single-user building no more than one such sign per building.
- **Permit requirements** must include the City as an additional insured on liability insurance for any sign overhanging the public sidewalk in a public right-of-way.

<u>Window Signs</u> – no restriction on the number or size of signs taped or adhered to windows. A glass entry door, however, shall not be covered with signs so views into the lease space are prevented.

<u>Wall-mounted Directory Signs for multi-use buildings</u> – the sign shall be located beside the entry door and shall not exceed 12 square feet in area.

PROGRAM GOALS

- 2. Inspire and enable significant redevelopment, both city-wide and in the urban core, reusing and repurposing existing vacant and under-utilized properties, in which there are significant market and/or physical condition barriers to development or redevelopment.
- 3. Create the opportunity for new jobs throughout the City of Hagerstown and Washington County.
- 4. Increase the value of Hagerstown's residential, commercial, and mixed-use properties.
- 5. Strengthen and improve market rate rental properties and increase homeownership.

Program Summary

The goal of the Fire Suppression System Grant Program is to contribute to adding lifesaving fire suppression systems and lower the financial barriers associated with the installation of Water Service/Fire Lines, Meter Vaults, Water Meters, and other components directly associated with the addition and/or upgrade of a National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) compliant fire suppression system. This program is subject to funding availability and operates on a first-come, first-served basis. All projects must pertain to residential, commercial, or mixed-use buildings.

- 1. The Fire Suppression System Grant can be utilized toward any/all expenses directly associated with installing or upgrading NFPA-compliant fire suppression systems required to meet current Code standards. Examples include:
 - a. Installation of Automatic Sprinkler Systems;
 - b. Costs related to an increase in Water Service/Fire Lines;
 - c. Installation or Upgrade of Meter Vaults;
 - d. Install New or Upgrade/Replace outdated heads/piping;
 - e. Replace mains/backflow devices
- 2. Grants require a 1:1 match from the applicant. Example: a \$25,000 grant would require an additional \$25,000 investment from the applicant for a total project investment of \$50,000. Matching costs can include all work related to fire suppression system installation (interior and exterior).

3. A project must be defined as planned or pre-construction. Work <u>must not begin</u> until the City provides applicant with both City and MHT approval. Projects must be completed no later than 9 months from Review Committee approval and receipt of Letter of Commitment. The applicant will be required to demonstrate expenditures equal to the grant and the required match related to work that was completed.

The program provides a grant to approved projects for the following amount:

- 1. Fully residential, commercial, professional office, retail, and mixed-use projects.

- 2. Fire suppression system installation or upgrade projects that are compliant and operable with a water service meter sized less than four (4) inches are not eligible for this grant funding.
- 3. Projects that do not meet the minimum investment threshold.
- 4. Applicants who are not in good standing with the City, County, State or Federal Governments.
- 5. Non-profit development applicants.
- 6. Grants will not be provided for properties containing certain types of businesses, including: pawn shops, gun shops, massage parlors, adult video/book shop, adult entertainment facilities, tanning salons, check-cashing facilities, gambling facilities, tattoo parlors, liquor stores.

III. Funding Guidelines

- 1. Funding may be secured by multiple sources.
- 2. Applicants may apply and utilize other grant and incentive programs.
- 3. No City loans, grants, or pass-through funding may be used as a part of the applicant's match.

IV. Grant Process

- 1. A development plan, which outlines the renovation schedule and major components of the project, shall accompany the application form.
- 2. Applications shall be reviewed by the Invest Hagerstown Review Committee, consisting of:
 - a. Planning & Economic Development Director
 - b. Finance Director
 - c. Community Development Manager
 - d. Neighborhood Services Manager
 - e. Economic Development Specialist
- 3. Applications will be accepted on a continual basis based on funding availability and the Invest Hagerstown Review Committee will review new applications each month.

- 4. The Invest Hagerstown Review Committee will evaluate the application against the following criteria:
 - a. Adherence to the Eligibility Criteria outlined in Section I, Paragraphs 1 through 6
 - b. Consistency with goals of the Fire Suppression System Grant program
 - c. Impact on immediate neighborhood
 - d. Financial feasibility of proposed funding sources
 - e. Potential for job creation
 - f. Development experience of applicant
 - g. Proposed timeline and completion date
 - h. Investment impact
- 5. Approved applications will receive a Letter of Commitment from the City of Hagerstown which may be used to assist in financing the project.
- 6. The Maryland Historical Trust (MHT) must approve all applications for design review. Applicant is required to provide a scope of work, project plans, photos of structure and other relevant project information. Once applicant submits this information, **DPED** will forward the project proposal to MHT for review.
- 7. The project will be regulated through the Planning and Code Administration Department, Utilities Department, and Fire Department.
- 8. Monthly status updates shall be supplied by the developer to the City of Hagerstown Department of Planning and Economic Development dced@hagerstownmd.org.
- 9. When the fire suppression aspect of the project is complete according to the approved application and development plan and the system receives all required inspection approvals, the City shall award the grant money with proof of project expenditures and proof of matching fund expenditures.

MOTION:

I hereby move for the City to withdraw from a grant agreement with the Maryland Department of Emergency Management for the design of a hydraulic model of a portion of the City's storm drainage system. This grant, for \$75,000, was awarded in 2024; however, these funds have not been released by FEMA, and there has been no indication that they will be released before 2029, if at all. The City will reapply for similar grant if the program reopens.

Brian Brandt, Smithsburg Town Manager reached to discuss the opportunity for a MS4/Stormwater partnership between the Town of Smithsburg and The City of Hagerstown. Per Mr. Brandt, the proposed project is a stream restoration on Beaver Creek located on City property (Crystal Falls Drive - Breichner Water Plant). As you are aware, this property is located within the corporate boundary of the Town of Smithsburg. Please see attached letter from Mr. Brandt.

Staff subsequently met with the Town of Smithsburg and RK&K Engineering to discuss a proposed stream restoration project on Beaver Creek at the Breichner Water Treatment Plant Property. This project will be funded by the Town of Smithsburg and they will be responsible for all permitting, design, bidding, etc. required should this project move forward. The Town of Smithsburg has assured the City that they are only requesting permission to do the project and, as such, will assume all responsibility as it pertains to this project to include ensuring the City has access at all times and restoration of the City property once construction is complete.

Staff has no objections to this project and will answer any questions during the November 18, 2025 Work Session. Should the Mayor and Council decide to move forward with approval of this request, staff will prepare a Motion for the November 25, 2025 Regular Session.

On behalf of the Town of Smithsburg, I am writing to respectfully request permission to construct a stream restoration project along Beaver Creek on the City of Hagerstown Reservoir property, extending from Crystal Falls Drive to Old Mill Road.

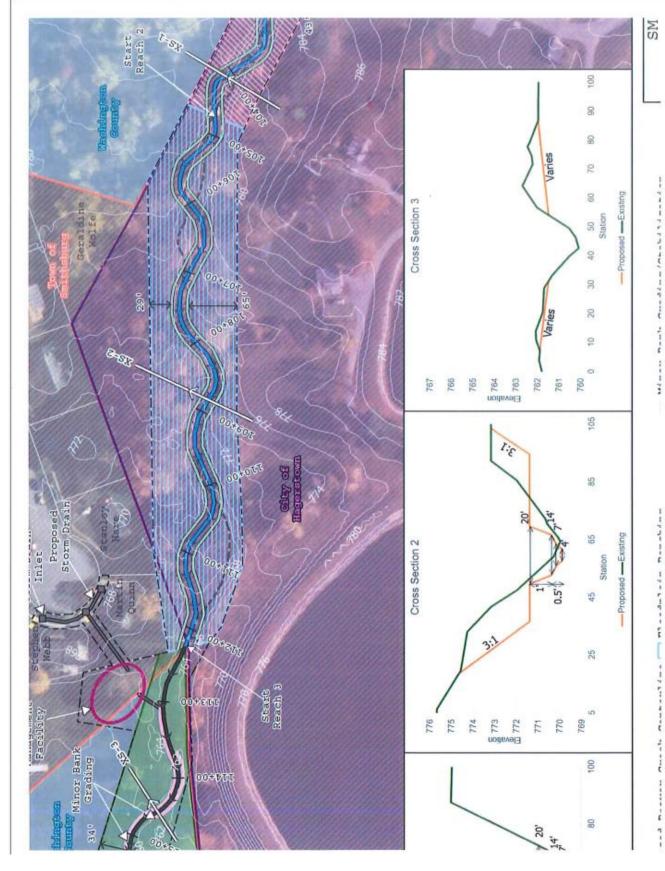
This project was identified through a recent watershed assessment that evaluated opportunities for water quality improvements within the Smithsburg Town boundary. The analysis highlighted this reach of Beaver Creek as a priority restoration site due to significant erosion and degradation throughout the stream valley and the channel's proximity to the Hagerstown Reservoir dam. The existing conditions not only compromise local water quality but also present a potential long-term risk to dam stability and other nearby infrastructure.

The proposed restoration will address these concerns by stabilizing and enhancing the stream channel that is encroaching on the reservoir dam, reducing erosion and instabilities, and improving overall watershed health. In addition, the project will improve aquatic and riparian habitats, contributing to ecological uplift and increasing resilience in the face of future storm events. This project will assist the Town in meeting its Chesapeake Bay impervious area restoration requirements, supporting regulatory compliance while delivering measurable environmental benefits to the community, including the City of Hagerstown. The project will be funded by the Town of Smithsburg at no cost to the City.

The project design will be mindful of the existing Reservoir toe of dam, outfall pipe, and fire hydrant discharge points. It will provide stable conveyance and ensure that this critical infrastructure may continue to function properly. We are committed to coordinating closely with the City throughout design and construction to ensure that the project is implemented responsibly and in alignment with shared priorities. Following project completion, the Town will assume responsibility for inspection and maintenance of the restored stream corridor to ensure long-term success. To formalize this partnership, a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) will be drafted between the Town and City.

By proactively addressing these issues, the City and Town will safeguard important infrastructure, protect public resources, and strengthen community resilience. We appreciate your consideration of this request and look forward to the opportunity to partner with the City to improve the health and stability of Beaver Creek.
